ple was loving service. If this king-  
dom is to be realized three things  
are necessary: (1) Redeemed person-  
alities—Christianity in first of all re-  
deemed individuals. When God want-  
ed to redeem the world he did not  
give to it a book or a creed, but a  
life. Personality is still the might-  
est force in the world. Jesus sanc-  
tified himself—so must everyone who  
would in any way advance the king-  
dom. We must never lose sight of  
this fact—Christianity must first of  
all be personal. (2) Loving sacrifi-  
cial service. For the sake of oth-  
ers Jesus sanctified himself; that He  
might serve men. Jesus gives the  
central place in His parables on con-  
duct to service, the man most severe-  
ly condemned is not the positive sin-  
ner, but the man who does not serve.  
The great work of the church is to  
turn out multitudes who have caught  
the spirit of the Master and have  
given themselves to loving service.  
There are many things concerning  
which we grow heated, which are  
only secondary in importance. The  
one thing that is all important is—  
Can the living Christ lay hold of  
broken men and women and make  
them whole? Can He transform soci-  
ety and business until the law of  
the neighborhood holds everywhere?  
The great obstacle to the advance of  
the kingdom has been man's narrow  
views of the sway of Christianity.  
Whole sections of life are left out  
of its influence entirely, still, we are  
told that the preacher must not in-  
troduce business or politics to Christ.  
The Sermon on the Mount, men say,  
is for Sunday and other special oc-  
casions, but it is too high and too  
good for daily life. In short, it is  
impractical. But if by practical you  
mean those principles that led us  
into the world war, then in the name  
of Heaven give us the impractical  
principles of the Sermon on the  
Mount. "In all our ways we must  
acknowledge Him."—This means busi-  
ness and politics. (3) Everyone must play their part.  
Young people need to realize each  
one has a mighty work to do. Each  
life must reflect some feature of  
Christ's life. If ever the kingdom is  
to be built—part of the building  
must be done by each one. No life  
is too insignificant. Let us as pro-  
fessing Christians, remember these  
things. The first great necessity of  
life is a redeemed personality; this  
redeemed personality must be spent  
in loving service, seen with a wider  
vision than ever before and let us  
remember that each individual has  
his work to do.
