Notice of Sitings of Revising Officers

D. 1924, at the Temperance Hall, in the Village of Jarvis, in the County of Haldimand, to hear complaints as to the lists of voters for all the Polling Sub-Divisions in the Village of Jarvis, and that His Honor Judge Hopkins will be the Revising Officer, and his Clerk will be Ivan W. Hopkins, whose address is His Store in the Village of Jarvis.

Each Sitting will commence at 9:30 o'clock in the forenoon and will continue until 11 o'clock in the forenoon.

On Friday, the Third day of October, A. D. 1924, at The Council Chambers—Market Building—Hagersville, in the County of Haldimand, to hear complaints as to the lists of voters for all the Polling Sub-Divisions in the Village of Hagersville, and that His Honor Judge Hopkins will be the Revising Officer, and his Clerk will be J. T. Park, whose address is His Store in the Village of Hagersville.

Each Sitting will commence at 10 o'clock in the forenoon and will continue until 1 o'clock in the afternoon, namely:

On Thursday, the Ninth day of October, A. D. 1924, at Peacock's Hall, in the Village of Jarvis, in the County of Haldimand, to hear complaints as to the lists of voters for all the Polling Sub-Divisions in the Township of Walpole, and that His Honor Judge Hopkins will be the Revising Officer, and his Clerk will be S. A. Thompson, whose address is His Office in the Village of Nanticoke.

Each Sitting will commence at 9:30 o'clock in the forenoon and will continue until 11:30 o'clock in the forenoon.

AND FURTHER TAKE NOTICE that any voter who desires to complain that his name or the name of any person entitled to be entered on the said lists has been omitted from the same, or that the names of any

persons who are not entitled to be voters have been entered thereon, may on or before the following dates apply, complain or appeal to have his name or the name of any other person entered on, or removed from, the list.

For the Village of Jarvis, 1st October.

For the Village of Hagersville, 30th September.

For the Township of Walpole, 6th October.

AND FURTHER TAKE NOTICE that such appeals must be by notice in writing in the prescribed form, signed by the complainant in duplicate, and given to the Clerk of the Revising Officers, or left for him at his address, as stated above.
