PLEBISCITE VOTE IS LIMITED TO TWO QUESTIONS

"Yes" or "No" on Continuance of Ontario Temperance Act, and on Government Control

A Very Fair Ballot Has Been Evolved by the Government

It has at last been decided that two questions, and two only, shall be submitted to the electors of the Province of Ontario at the Plebiscite Vote on the question of intoxicating liquors at the elections, to be held on October 23 next.

Settlement by the Cabinet of the issue on the form of the questions following conference in the Prime Minister's office between Mr. Ferguson and Attorney-General Nickle, representing the Government; John Macdonald, Rev. T. Albert Moore, D.D., and George H. Lees, of Hamilton, representing the prohibition forces, and E. F. Hellmuth, K.C., F. L. Monahan and Cyril D. Boyce, Moderation Leaguers.

The official Government announcement is as follows:

The first consideration of a Government in its legislation and the administration thereof must always be the moral and material progress and welfare of the people it serves. The greatest force in the securing of law and order and the suppression of crime and elimination of distress is public opinion. The purpose of the plebiscite is to secure from the people such an expression of opinion as will enable the Government to adopt such measures as will have behind them the fullest possible public approval and support.

The Ontario Temperance Act as amended and strengthened from time to time during the past eight years is now the governing principle in the handling of our liquor problem. It is obvious, therefore, that the first enquiry must be directed to ascertaining if the people desire to continue the principle of this law. One of the questions will therefore be: "Are You in Favor of the Continuance of the Ontario Temperance Act?" If the majority answer in the affirmative there can be no doubt as to the course to be followed.

If, on the other hand, the majority answer in the negative, it means that some new method of dealing with the sale and beverage of beer and intoxicating liquor must be adopted. The Government therefore asks another expression of opinion by asking a second question: "Are You in Favor of the Sale of a Beverage of Beer and Spirituous Liquor in Sealed Packages Under Government Control?"
