REPORT OF FINANCE COMMITTEE To the Warden and Members of the County Council: Gentlemen.—The Finance Committee beg leave to submit report as follows:

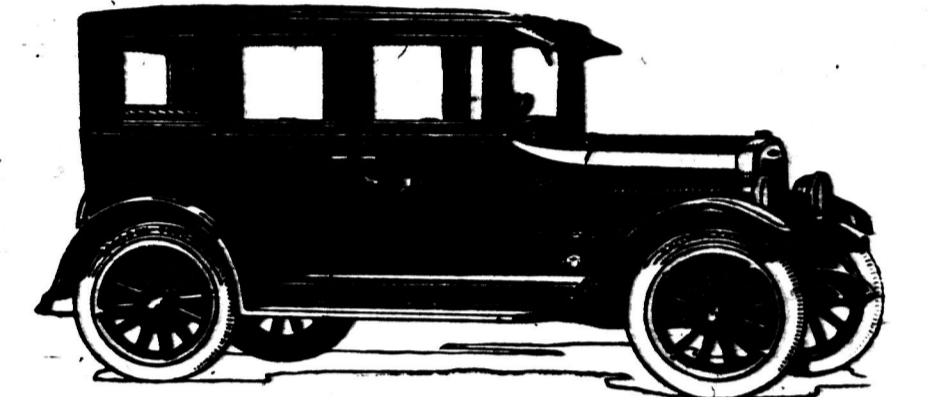
