**FUTURE OF THE PROGRESSIVES**  
A prediction that the Progressive party in Ontario would come back strong after the next Federal election was made during the week by John W. King (North Huron). "The Progressive party," he said, "is a modest, retiring party, and we have been subjected to political thrusts, some of them not very clean, from all sides of the House—even from our own side; but I desire to affirm right here that not only will the Progressive party come out after the next election, but will come back more than a mere remnant—more than a sad remnant. The Progressive party is here to do business and will do business in this House after all the other members, I was going to say, had passed into oblivion, but I do not say that because I know there are a great many hon. members of this House whose names will go down in the annals of Canadian history. The Progressive party has its roots in the soil and they will not be very easily eradicated."

**THE PRIME MINISTER AND NATIONAL UNITY**  
A high tribute to the contributions the Prime Minister has made from time to time in cementing together more closely the diverse economic parts of this country was paid by W. G. Raymond (Brantford), who, in urging the need of conciliation, of compromise and of co-operation if the unity of this Dominion was to be preserved and enhanced, said: "If that spirit is to be carried out, if these rifts which some say exist in Confederation, are to be closed, if there is any hope of keeping together the provinces and having them united in a happy and progressive country I certainly believe that the Prime Minister is the man, who in the spirit he has displayed throughout his life is most likely to be effective in bringing about that great national ideal."

It is urging that the doors of Canada be thrown wide open to the immigrants from Europe and populate this country as rapidly as possible without restriction, S. W. Jacobs (Montreal) expounded some novel ideas in the House on Thursday and uttered some characteristic witticisms. A fair sample is contained in his concluding sentences. "My theory is to allow the people to go wherever they want to go. If they find they are not fitted for farming, they will go elsewhere. We have a continent to fill up. Surely it offers possibilities to every person who comes in. The man who is not a success as a farmer may become a member of Parliament."

Angus McDonald (Temiskaming) suggested that the party with that doctrine should be called the Jacobs party, to which Mr. Jacobs retorted: "The original Jacob had only twelve sons and he went to Egypt and was a success there."
