REPORT OF GOOD ROADS COMMITTEE

To the Warden and Members of the County Council:

Gentlemen—Your Committee beg leave to report as follows:

- The paylists and accounts submitted to your committee have been carefully checked over and recommend them for payment.
- Would recommend that we accept the offer of Messrs. F. B. Mahble Co., Ltd. for furnishing and delivering on Road No. 19 crushed stone screenings, distance 3 1/4 miles as per his letter dated April 15, 1925.
- Would recommend that we purchase 2 No. 2 Road Boss graders from Canada Ingot Iron Co., Guelph, Ont., at \$150.00 each delivered at the nearest railway station within the county where required.
- Would recommend that this Committee have power to purchase material that they consider suitable for the metal bases to be constructed on the County Highways System during 1925 and also have power to arrange the price of said material.
- The Superintendent hopes to be able to commence the greater part of the work that is to be on the County Highway System during the present year not later than May 1st so as to take advantage of farm help during the months of May and June.
