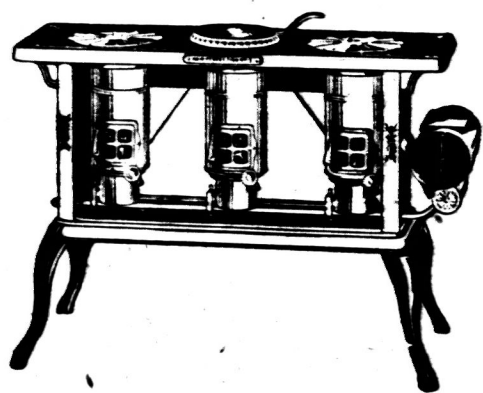

REPORT OF GOOD ROADS COMMITTEE

To the Warden and Members of the County Council:
Gentlemen—Your Good Roads Committee beg leave to report as follows:
The Pay-lists and accounts up to July 31 have been checked over and recommend that they be paid.

There was considerable lost time during July owing to wet weather and we are endeavoring to speed up to have the season's work completed in good time.

It is estimated that on the 15th day of August, the following will be the work yet uncompleted:
Road 3—2 miles to roll and put on screenings.
Road 11—½ mile to roll and put on screenings.
Road 18—3 miles to put on screenings.
Road 19—3 miles to put on the 4th course of screenings.
Road 21—2 miles 4-in. base, screenings and rolling.
Road 24—6 miles to roll and put on screenings.
Road 26—1 mile to put on screenings.
Road 30—1½ miles to put on the screenings.
Road 31—1½ miles to put on the screenings.

That the Treasurer be authorized to pay for one car of cement on the order of the Chairman of the Good Roads Committee.
