Your committee beg to recommend that a grant of \$100 be made to the Haldimand Gas Consumers' Association to defray expenses in connection with their meetings and that the usual grant of \$50 be made to the Warden.

The special Finance Committee beg to notify this Council that they have sold \$100,000 of debentures to H. R. Bain and Company, their tender being the highest viz. \$99.76 per \$100. To the end of Nov. 30, 1925, the County Treasurer reports the total receipts to be \$147,673.17 and the total expenditures to be \$147,390.97, the balance on hand in cash and in the bank being \$282.20. In Good Roads account the total receipts including bank loans were \$182,876.82 and the expenditure to Nov. 30, 1925, \$183,472.20, leaving an overdraft of \$595.38.

Also, your committee beg to recommend that the usual amount of \$40 for caretaking be paid to Mr. Walsh. We beg to report that the debenture indebtedness is as follows: Debenture debt to 1925 \$419,000.00 Paid on above to date 72,417.94

Balance unpaid \$346,582.06 Debentures sold in Dec '25 100,000.00

Total \$446,582.06

We recommend that the Treasurer be authorized to pay our indebtedness to the Province as soon as the returns from the sale of the debentures is received from H. R. Bain and Co. All of which is respectfully submitted.
