"God so loved the world that He gave" it the gift of Jesus, who  
revealed to us God, and who showed us that God's greatest at-  
tribute is Love. If Christmas is primarily a season of loving re-  
membrance it is because Jesus has taught us that love lies at the  
very heart of God. We give gifts because of the love we bear our  
friends. God gave the world a priceless gift because He loved all  
men. And so the message of Christmas is a message of love.

But it also carries a message of Peace. "Peace on earth,  
Goodwill to men" sang the angelic choir, and that song has re-  
echoed adown the ages ever since. It is true that the things that  
make for peace are not cherished as they should be. It is true  
that men have not learned to the full the meaning of brotherhood  
and good will, but the Christmas message nevertheless is a mes-  
sage of Peace. Again the bells of Christmas call men to be at
