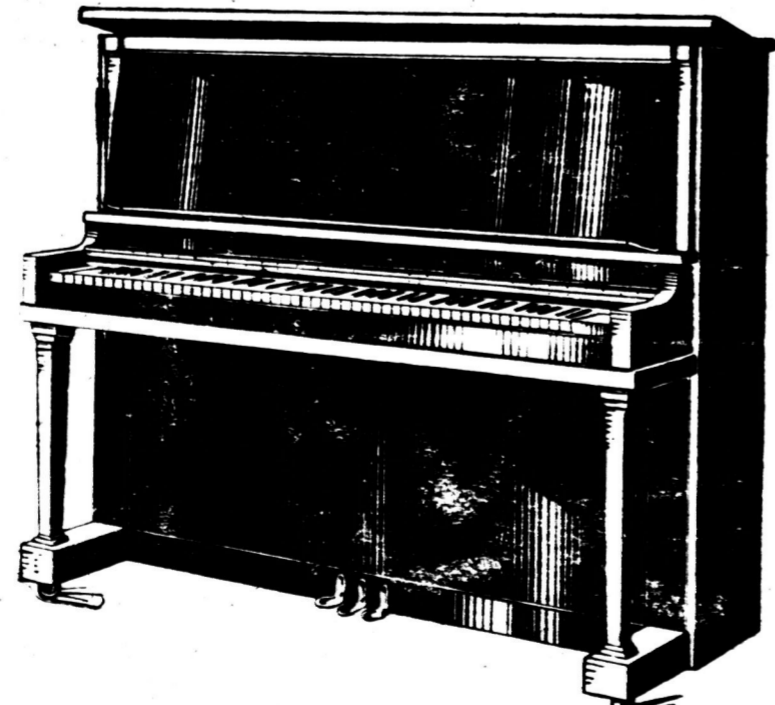

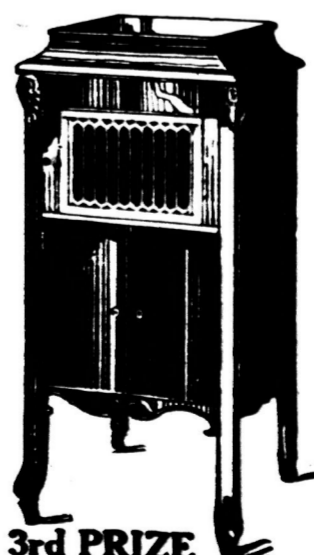

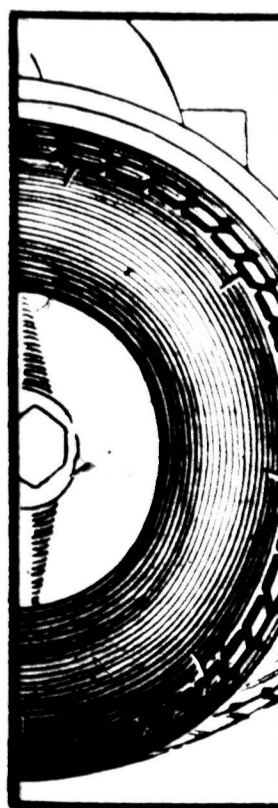
NOTICE TO CREDITORS
