### CANADIAN DAIRY PRODUCTS DECREASE IN CHEESE VALUE

The miscellaneous products of dairy factories in Canada in 1924 comprise nearly 200 different items, including butter, cream, and cheese. The total value of these products in 1924 was \$26,165,559, an increase of nearly two million dollars compared with the preceding year.

The production of cheese in Canada in 1924 totalled 151,673,880 pounds, valued at \$24,518,734. Compared with the preceding year an increase of 49,504 pounds is shown in the quantity, but a decrease of over four million dollars in the value. The average price per pound was 16 cents in 1924 and 19 cents in 1923.

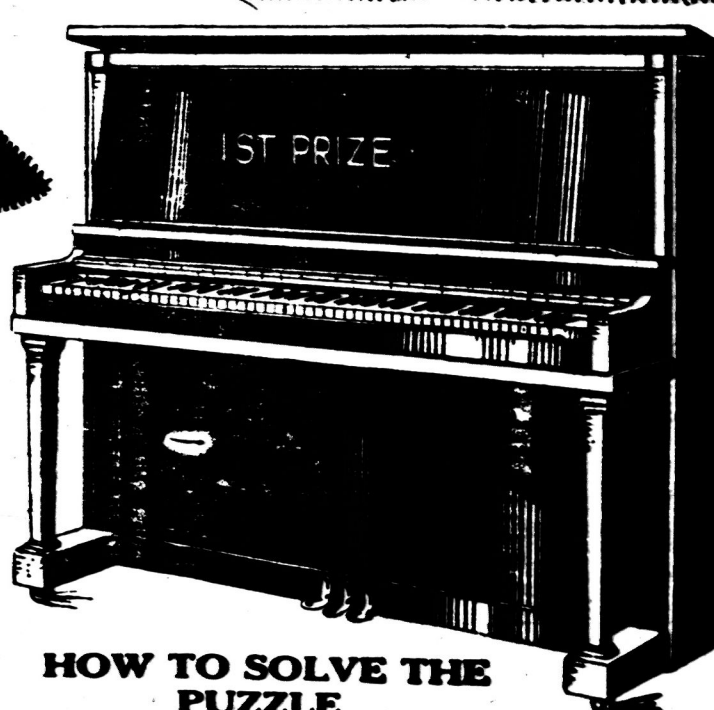

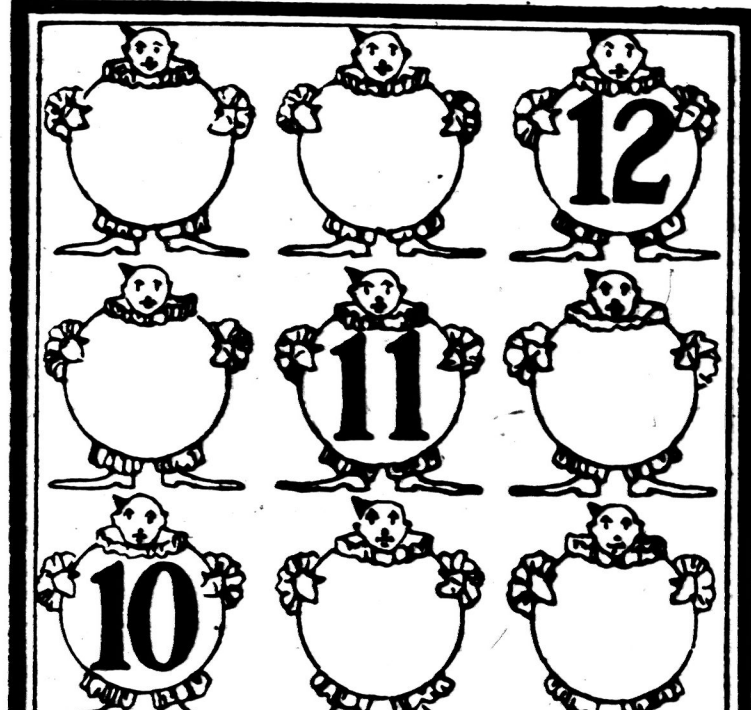

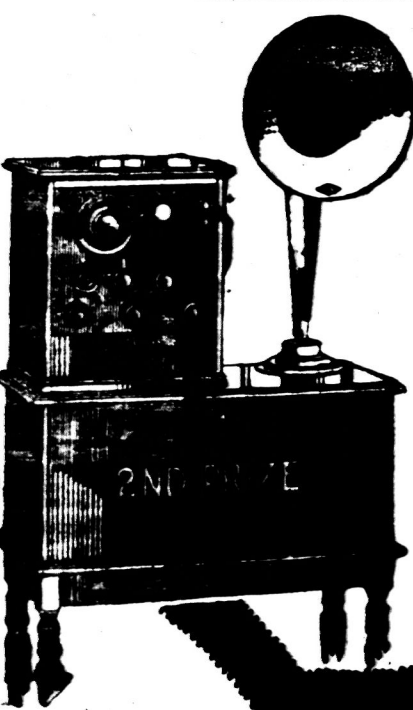
