After escaping from the house, did not attempt to go back and rescue the other two occupants, his wife and son.

Adam Cassibean, who was injured Tuesday last week in an explosion at a Fluor-Spar mine at Moira, Lake Huron, died in the hospital at Peterboro, last Friday morning. His death makes the second fatality resulting out of the accident. W. R. Johnson, of Peterboro, having succumbed on the train while being rushed to the hospital. The men were at the bottom of a 52 foot shaft and it is thought one of them struck an unexploded dynamite charge with his pick. An inquest will be held.

In an attempt to loot, singlehanded, the Stratford Branch of the Royal Bank, a lone bandit, whom the police have not yet apprehended, shot and wounded the bank manager, F. P. Hughes, on an afternoon last week. The robber is described as fair, light build, about 30 years of age. Entering the bank to make change, he approached the teller, W. Johnson, and commanded "Hands up, everybody." Johnson dodged behind the counter. The robber became alarmed and started for the door, but the manager came out of his office, gun in hand, whereupon the robber fled, the bullet hitting Mr. Hughes in the right arm. The bandit then jumped into his car and started out of the village.



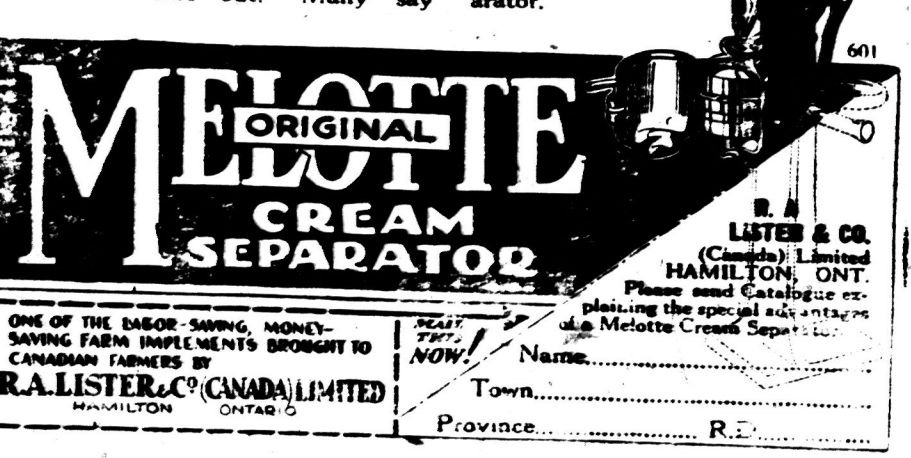
