**BAPTIST ASSOCIATION**

The annual meeting of the Norfolk Baptist Association was held in Waterford, June 8th, 9th and 10th. Tuesday was Women's Day, when representatives of the various Circles and Bands, held sessions, morning, afternoon and evening.

There was a large attendance at the opening meeting which began with a prayer service led by Mrs. H. R. Crabb of Simcoe, who read from Acts 3, the story of the healing of the lame man. She emphasized the importance of service in the Christian life that one might find "at the end of the road" just the love and usefulness service he had put into life. There was an earnest spirit of prayer in the many petitions which followed for the Association's sessions and the work it represents. Conferences on Circle and Band work were led by Miss Stillwell of Chesapeake, Circle Director, and Mrs. Burgess of Villa Nova, Band Director, during which some helpful suggestions were made as to methods, programs, etc.

It was suggested that the monthly Board letters be carried after the meeting to the sick and shut-in. The giving of the tenth to the Lord's work should be the standard of giving. The object of the Circle was educational to supplement the giving of the Churches to Missions. The object of the Band is primarily the conversion of the children, so the first meeting of the year in some Bands is a decision and consecration meeting. The director requested every Band to learn the Song of the Mission Stations in last December. Link that next year it may be sung in chorus.

The afternoon session began with Devotional Exercises led by Mrs. Geo. Ronson, Jr., of Courtland, who drew lessons from Malachi 1, comparing it with the beautiful hymn, "Take my life and let it be, consecrated Lord to Thee," also Romans 12—a living sacrifice.

Mrs. J. D. MacLachlan warmly welcomed the Association on behalf of the women of the Waterford church. Mrs. E. G. Dale of Delhi, replied, saying it was a great joy to be bound together in the ties of Christian fellowship and service.

Mrs. (Rev.) S. H. Lamb of Villa Nova, this year's President, gave a strong and soul-stirring appeal for advance in Missionary effort by bringing to the Convention the command "Go," giving reasons why the Christian Church should go, where and when. She spoke of the marvelous transformation the Gospel has made wherever preached—among the New Canadians in our own land, even to the savage in Africa. Now is the time to go for the Bible is translated into 600 languages and the world is growing smaller as scientific inventions rapidly follow one another. Opportunity brings responsibility. Pray, give, go.

Interesting and encouraging reports of groups of Circles were given by Mrs. H. S. Craven of Delhi; Mrs. E. Hayes of Hartford; Mrs. Lloyd Kelly, St. William; Miss Stillwell of Chesapeake, and Mrs. Newman of Vittoria. Many of the Circles have sent boxes to India and to Toronto Mission stations.

The Director's report, by Miss Stillwell of Chesapeake, showed a deficit over last year of \$80 in Foreign Missions, though an advance in Home Missions was reported. It was suggested this amount be made up by each of the 20 Circles assuming a \$4 special. Increased membership was reported in the Circles and an advance in Link and Visitor subscriptions urged.

Mrs. E. D. Heath of Delhi, spoke on Temperance as included in Home Mission work, and urged every Circle, whether it is W.C.T.U., to take up the work of educating the people, especially the boys and girls in the schools and Sunday Schools along Temperance lines. She suggested the Circles appoint some one to do this work and to see that the new "Health Book," recommended by the Premier and Department of Education be taught in the schools. She touched on the failure of Government Control in the Western Provinces where conditions are worse, friends of Temperance say, than in the old license days. The "Whispering Campaign" against the O.T.A. must be met and stopped. Please do not tempt the children in the homes by making dandelion and other home-made wines. One boy who had been taught at school, asked his mother not to make wine for fear he might acquire the taste for alcohol. "Be women," the speaker said, "women who can stand for what women should, the defense of the boys and girls from this awful traffic." She urged the Circles to undertake the distributing of Temperance literature sent out by W.C.T.U. Headquarters. If we educate the youth of today, Prohibition is safe for the future. Educate, vote and pray without ceasing or fainting. Mrs. Heath was a very forceful address and must result in renewed effort among Norfolk women for Prohibition.

The Roll Call of Bands followed with goods reports. Townsend Centre's report was especially fine and four representatives sang a missionary song: Hazel Hellyer and Shirley Hellyer, nieces of our missionary to India, Clara Hellyer, and Helen Nestor one of our New Canadians, a smiling flaxen-haired child. Mrs. Burgess, Band Director, in her report emphasized the importance of moulding the child life that our churches may continue to carry out the great commission. Norfolk's hope and the hope of the churches of Norfolk, is in the children.

The prayer hour was conducted by Mrs. A. Saul of Boston, who noted the many promises for answered prayer. (Continued on Page 5)
