urged the importance of prayer for missions and emphasized the promise "If ye ask, I will do." Several prayers followed for the work and Mrs. Johnson of Boston and Mrs. J. Thompson of Hartford (nee Ethel James of Waterford) sang beautiful solos. Miss Katharine Duncombe presented the claims of our Bureau of Literature and Mrs. H. Newcombe, of Simcoe, "The Link and Visitor" and an intensely interesting address on "A Missionary's Wife in India" by Mr. John Craig, one of our retired missionaries, brought a very successful afternoon's program to a close. A missionary's wife in India leads a very busy life. She learns the language, manages the servants who need eternal vigilance. She cares for the children who must be protected from scorpions, snakes, and the sun even on a cloudy day. If there are no children she tours or teaches in the boarding school, cares for the pupils' health, food and supplies. She prepares all food and the equipment for her husband to take on tour, cares for the Sunday School work, the industrial work, lace and jewelry work, leads women's meetings and performs many other duties.

The main addresses of the evening session were given by Mrs. Craig and Dr. Farmer of McMaster University. Mrs. Craig told of the work in several of the mission stations in India and of the great need of strong men to man the fields some of which are without resident missionaries. In 40 years a great deal has been accomplished and the membership grown from 1200 to 19,000, but the Canadian Baptists are responsible for 4,500,000 Terebus and the hundred missionaries on the staff, the 10 ordained pastors and 100 unordained teachers, besides Bible women, were inadequate to meet the wonderful opportunity. Prayer is greatly needed for health of our missionaries in that trying climate. Instances of God's special care in special danger were given to prove the value of prayer. The work needs men, money and above all prayer.

Dr. Farmer, who has been a professor in McMaster University for 30 years, was warmly welcomed by the audience as he rose to speak. The theme of his address was the words of Jesus: "The Father hath sent me, even so send I you." He came to seek and to save the lost. Those who are his disciples are here on the Lord's business. He said: "We must do the works of Him who sent us while it is day. The disciples said, 'We cannot but speak the things we have seen and heard,' and now God is counting on us." The speaker pointed out the opportunities for Home Mission work in all our cities which were handicapped by debt. The Lord's business requires capital as well as men. Dr. Farmer's address was full of inspiration and most result in new impetus in carrying on in this our day. "Life," he said, "is just an opportunity to lay hold on Eternal Life."

The choir sang a very beautiful anthem "Seek ye the Lord." Mr. T. C. Savage in especially fine voice singing the obligato. Miss Marie Clark officiated most capably at the organ during the day and before the evening service Mr. Louis Gibson gave a very enjoyable organ recital.

A very beautiful pageant, "The Challenge of the Cross," was presented by the Vittoria Circle members and was a fitting closing to an inspiring
