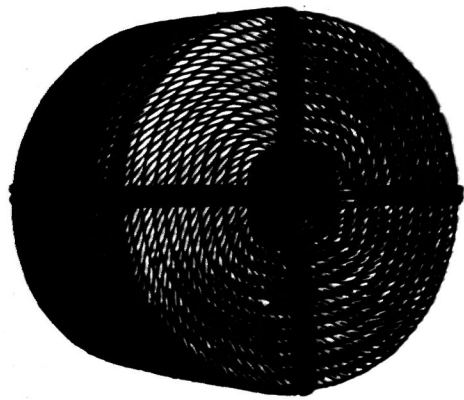

REPORT OF GOOD ROADS COMMITTEE

To the Warden and Members of the County Council:

Gentlemen—Your Good Roads Committee beg leave to report as follows:

1. We have examined the pay lists and accounts submitted and recommend that they be paid.

2. Would recommend that permission be given Mr. Robert Miller of Rainham Centre, and Mr. M. P. Werner of Selkirk, and Mr. C. Held and Son of Fisherville, to install a gasoline service station in front of their premises providing they comply with the regulations which the by-law requires.

3. Would recommend that no action be taken re damage to car on the County Road owned by Harvey Betler.

4. Work was commenced on seasonal program on May 15th and since that time satisfactory progress has been made.

5. That Mr. Gleny be appointed to represent this County along with representatives from Lincoln and Welland Counties in an interview with the Minister of Highways re taking over of the Talbot Road as a Provincial Highway from Canboro Village eastward through Haldimand, Lincoln and Welland Counties.

This list of appropriations demands a county rate of 17 mills.

The Finance Committee recommend that grants of \$2000 each be made to the High Schools of Dunnville, Caledonia, Hagersville and Cayuga and of \$400 each to the Continuation S. at Jarvis and Selkirk; also that the Treasurer be authorized to forward to the Prov. Treas. the sum of \$35,670.89 being the indebtedness of the County to the Province, for Provincial Highways for 1925.

We recommend that the Warden and Treasurer be authorized to borrow \$50,000 from the Canadian Bank of Commerce to meet immediate expenditure.
