COUNTY POULTRY CULLING CAMPAIGN

Any person who is interested in securing instructions on culling hens may attend the Poultry Culling School but only those who pass the examination satisfactory to the instructor will be appointed as official poultry cullers for the county. Students may be either men or women and there is no age limit. The instructor will be an expert from Guelph College. Any person wishing to attend the Poultry Culling Schools should send their names to the Agricultural Office not later than July 13th. However, if you forget to send your names in to the office and wish to take instruction at the Poultry Culling Schools, do not hesitate to attend, as you will be made welcome.

Poultry Culling Schools will be conducted in the county as follows: Jarvis Fair Grounds, Wed., July 14 Cayuga Fair Grounds, Thurs, July 15 Dunnville Fair Grounds, Fri., July 16

Students are requested to assemble at the above places at 9 a.m. The instruction will be continued throughout the day until 4:30. Those coming from a distance may bring their lunch with them. The schools are free to all, and any person may attend one, or all of the schools if they think it advisable. The students qualifying as official poultry cullers for Haldimand County will be allotted any culling work in their own districts, and the remuneration for culling is two cents per bird.

The Institute Branches are requested to encourage as many as possible to attend the Poultry Culling Schools. We are pleased to report that the Sandusky Women's Institute have already recorded five students for the School, and we hope other Institutes Branches will do equally as well. This is an important project, as there are many hens in the county which are unprofitable and should be marketed as culls. We hope, therefore, that the County Institute will give this important project the consideration which it deserves. All existing organizations are requested to co-operate and make the Poultry Culling Schools an outstanding success.

A County Poultry Culling Campaign will be conducted in 1927 on a county basis, and featured as a major project of our work. The Poultry Culling Schools, and the individual culling accomplished this year, are merely a preliminary of the big poultry culling campaign we hope to conduct in 1927.

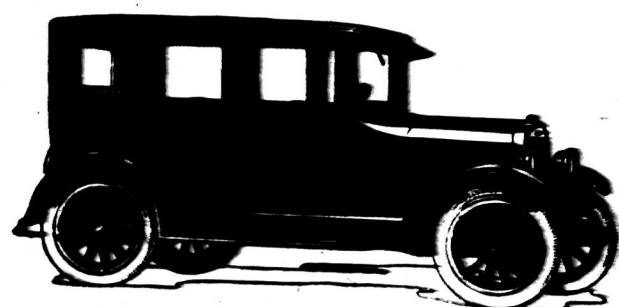

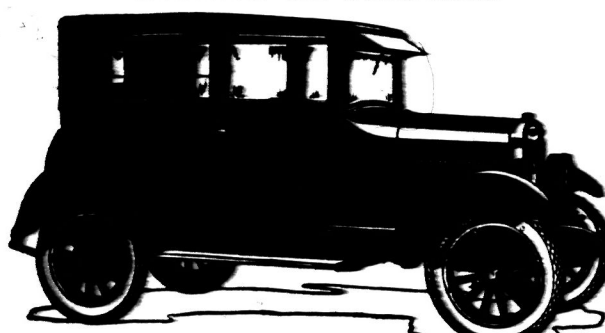
