Published for the first time, the official photographs and account of the Canadian Government Arctic Expedition of 1925 will interest readers of "Rod and Gun." The story of the trip to the ice fields with its three full pages of unusual photographs is only one of the interesting features of the July issue of "Rod and Gun," just published.
