FIELD CROP COMPETITION

The Jarvis Agricultural Society
have decided to hold a Standing Field
Crop Competition for the year 1926
in the crops of Oats and Fall Wheat.
In order to encourage the selection of
the best varieties of grains, the Dept.
of Agriculture has decided that com-
petitors should select from the follow-
ing:—

Fall Wheat — "Dawson's Golden
Chaff," Imperial Amber and O.A.C.
No. 104.

Oats — Banner; O.A.C. No. 72;
Alaska; Abundance; Yellow Russian;
Gold Rain and O.A.C. No. 3.

This does not prohibit the use of
any other variety than those named,
but when the judge is scoring a field,
if any other variety than the above
named Standard ones is grown, two
points will be deducted from the to-
tal score.

The only qualification necessary to
make entrance is that the exhibitor
become a member of the Society which
costs \$1.00, giving all the other priv-
ileges of the Society as well, and \$1.00
entry fee for each crop. Entries may
be made to the Secretary, Geo. L.
Miller, at any time before June 1st,
1926.
