

Farm Machinery Repairs Are Costly.

According to an investigation by the Department of Agriculture, the greatest single item in the cost of farm machinery is repairs. It is ebvious, therefore, that care in handling, oiling, tightening bolts, painting, etc., presents the greatest opportunity for saving. Careful housing of the machinery is important in Eastern Canada, but not so important on the prairie. On small farms, considerable saving may be effected by using expensive machinery in cooperation with neighbors. On large farms, the efficiency in saving manual labor may justify the purchase of expensive machinery.
