Aged Mother-in-Law Jokes

Carel Capek, the famous Czech author, with whose plays "R. U. R." and "The World We Live In" America is familiar, has been writing about the mother-in-law jokes. Capek holds that these jokes are found in the literature of all times—in the Hindu Veda, on Egyptian tombstones, in the Edda and in the Jewish and the Christian Bibles. In fact, he says, the mother-in-law jokes are such an old thing that they have become a sociological phenomenon.

Capek adds that it is strange that the proverbial mother-in-law joke always tells of the alleged unfriendly relations between herself and her son-in-law, but never of the antagonism to her daughter-in-law. In the same manner the henpecked husband is defended, but never the arbitrary treatment of a wife by her husband!

The playwright asserts that jests about the mother-in-law and the henpecked husband were created by men, not women. All such jokes arose in prehistoric times. They came from societies of men where in no women were allowed under penalty of death, and are most popular even to-day in men's clubs or men's gatherings. Men, he remarks, when they are together tell funny stories, while women among themselves remain thoroughly serious; indeed when a woman tells a story it is usually one of masculine origin.

The jokes about henpecked husbands are evidently the outcome of the matriarchate age, when the mother was at the head of the family. Even to-day among primitive races a son-in-law is not allowed to address the mother-in-law in person, nor may he mention her name.

Capek also says that the stock jokes expressing impatience over the sound health of a rich uncle or a rich aunt are also found in ancient cuts. Even savage cannibal tribes jest about healthy and wealthy uncles who live entirely too long.

LIGHTNING FIRE

Summer Season Calls Attention to Protective Measures

The heavy annual loss which Ontario farmers suffer from lightning fires could be reduced to almost nothing if all farm buildings were rodded in conformity with the standard set by the Ontario Lightning Rod Act of 1922. This Act which is considered to be the most up to date piece of legislation of its kind in the world has for its primary purpose the insuring of maximum protection to the person who has his buildings rodded. The day of the unscrupulous lightning rod agent has unfortunately passed. Every one is under a license from the Provincial Fire Marshal's office. A report on every installation is sent in to the Fire Marshal and if any are considered doubtful an inspector is sent out to lock the job over and if changes are necessary, to see that they are made. Any agents who have been found slipshod in their work are not allowed to hold their licenses.

Some idea of the progress that has been made since the Lightning-Rod Act came into force may be obtained by a study of the farm fire loss payments made by the farmers mutual fire insurance companies in this province. In 1917 lightning fires were responsible for 51 per cent. of the fire loss; in 1925 this had been reduced to 18 per cent., and in 1926 it was down to 12 per cent. Lightning is as much a menace as ever, the change has been brought by more efficient rodding. "Unless it is harnessed," said George F. Lewis, Deputy Fire Marshal of Ontario, "lightning must be considered the greatest fire menace on the farm."
