Sometimes only a drop of blood will show at a time and this slow bleeding will continue for many days before the bird dies. Sometimes a bird will apparently bleed to death from the small injury at the base of a feather. Examine a bird that seems pale and shows a splash of blood on the side of the body or wing. Asbird with that type of injury will surely die from weakness if the gradual loss of blood is not stopped.
