ARE YOU EDUCATED?

It seems to be about time that we had a restatement of our definition of education. We are demanding things of the person we call educated which we may have no right to demand of him.

The tendency to look on the educated as a super-intellectual seems to be a hangover from the days when Oliver Goldsmith modestly confessed to a yearning "amidst the swains to show my book-learned skill;" when he pictured the justices ranged around the village school master discoursing in "words of learned length and thundering sound: And still they gazed, and still the wonder grew that one small head could carry all he knew."

The sum total of things to be known has increased many hundred-fold since those days, so that even Goldsmith's village master might be considered as nothing remarkable. From this great store of knowledge the schools pick out certain things which are worth knowing and attempt to impart this knowledge to boys and girls. We can remember only a small part of what is thus learned, and the chances are that when we meet someone who has remembered the same things which we have remembered we call him educated.

This, of course, is wrong. Some of us may know things which we did not learn in school. It is conceivable that a man may be a most excellent teacher in some line without having heard of Eli Whitney, and it also is conceivable that one may be able to answer all of the Edison questions and still be a failure as a teacher.

THE TURKEY GOBBLER

The great American bird is not the hen for the eagle, but the turkey gobbler. The gobbler is lord of the barnyard and field marshal among the fowls. See his strut in the fullness of his pride, tail feathers spreading, head up, wings trailing, but not ingloriously! His crimson comb and purplish wattles give him the appearance of a red-faced and important gentleman who is querulously concerned in everything going on about him. Such pompos-

ity, dignity and swagger is rare. His irritable "Gobble, gobble, gobble" strikes terror into the hearts of little children, but is music in the ears of the more sophisticated who envision him trussed up in a roaster and stewing in his own juice.

The turkey has been closely associated with American history from the beginning. It will be remembered that at the famous Thanksgiving feast of the Pilgrim Fathers in November, 1621, in which the friendly Indians participated, wild turkey was the chief delicacy. Once this elusive bird was plentiful but now the wild species is all but extinct. In only a few sections of the country the wild turkey may be found. It begins to look as though the domestic turkey is destined to go the way of its progenitor. Young turkeys are hard to raise and the Thanksgiving and Christmas demand exceeds the supply. No one wants to see the day when the turkey has disappeared from the land and the proud gobbler struts and fumes no more.

There is no substitute for the turkey gobbler in sight. As compared with him the rooster is plebeian and the gander "a lesser breed without the law." The gobbler is a symbol of prosperity and a token of hospitality as well.

PROSPEROUS YEAR AHEAD

Predictions that this year would witness a slowing down in business as compared with 1926 has already been confuted, and business this year has run so far ahead of last year's that a depression during November and December could not put 1927 behind the preceding twelvemonth in business volume.

It will be recalled that about a year ago the perpetually down-in-the-mouth had forebodings that this was to be a bad year for the railroads, which combined with a building slump and the arrival of the automobile industry at the saturation point, was to shut down many of the steel mills. Apparently, the only reason they didn't predict a panic was fear of creating one prematurely.

This time the business pessimists played the wrong horse. Railroad freight loadings have broken all records. It has been a year of bumper crops out west and, in the main, favorable markets. Automobile manufacturers have established new records for earnings and production. Building operation have continued above normal throughout the country. And the United States Steel

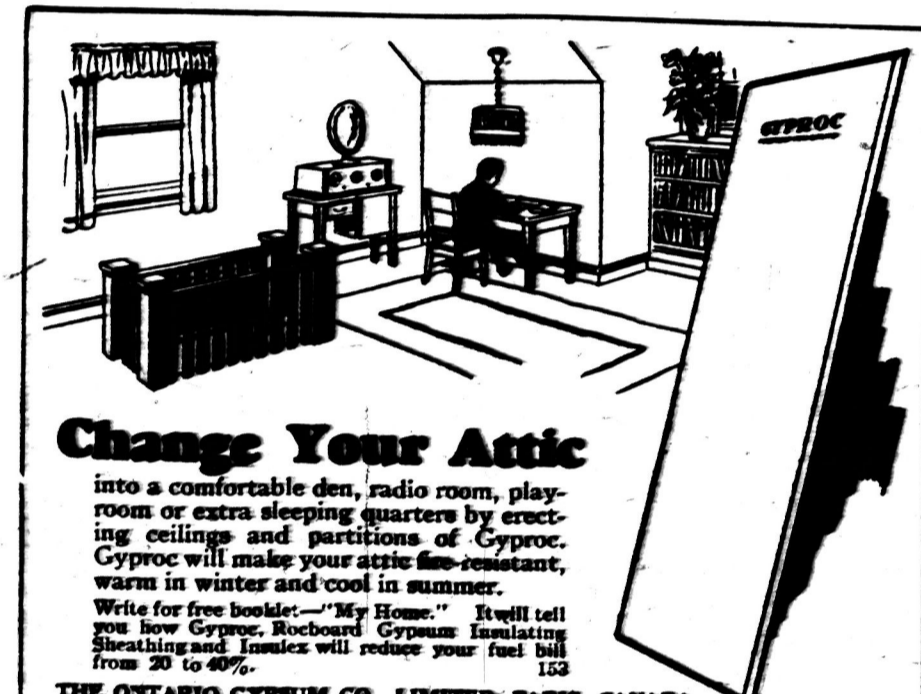
