the Township of Walpole and running west on the road allowance between Concessions 1 and 2 Township of Walpole to the Norfolk County line 2 1/2 miles; thence north along the town line between Norfolk and Haldimand approximately 1/4 mile connecting with the Norfolk County system, total distance 2 3/4 miles. Carried.

McDonald-Glenny—That the bylaw extending the County road system 2 1/4 miles be read a second time. Cd.

Penny-Honsberger—That the bylaw extending the County road system 2 1/4 miles be read a third time, signed, sealed and numbered and entitled a bylaw as in the original motion. Carried.

REPORT OF BUILDING COMMITTEE

To the Warden and Members of the County Council:
Gentlemen—We, your Building Committee have met and beg leave to report as follows:
We recommend that the barn on the county property be torn down and that a garage, sufficient to hold three cars be erected.
We recommend that the building in the goal yard be not removed until after the garage is built, if this is permitted by the Department so that the material from the building can be used in the garage, if necessary. If such material is not necessary for the garage, we recommend that the building be sold.
We also recommend that the gaoler be instructed to have Wedel Bros. put suitable plants in the flower beds.
We recommend that the Building Committee be authorized to have a chicken house and yard put up for the gaoler.

REPORT OF GOOD ROADS COMMITTEE

To the Warden and Members of the County Council:
Gentlemen—We, your Good Roads Committee beg leave to report as follows:
We have examined the pay lists and accounts submitted by the Superintendent and recommend them for payment.
The scarifier purchased from Waterous Limited has been attached to the Waterous roller and is giving us good service.
An inspector from the Steam Boiler Branch, Department of Labor, made an inspection of the Waterous steam roller and the test was satisfactory.
The same 1-team maintenance Nos. 2 & 3 Boes graders purchased from the Canada Ingot Iron Co., Guelph, Ontario, have been carefully distributed on the roads of the county highway system and will be a great service in keeping the surface on the roads in good shape.
We would recommend that the Township of Seneca and Camboro be given the service of the Marshall road roller. They furnish fuel and oil and keep the roller in a good state of repair and wash out boiler regularly. The County elects the engineer and they pay for his services.
The work has been delayed by wet weather, but we hope to be able to speed up by employing more help from the present time till harvest.
Mr. MacInnes, the inspecting engineer from the Department of Public Highways advises that he will be in the County next week, to assist the Superintendent in the discharge of his duties.
