IN THE EARLY PIONEER DAYS OF CANADA

A Sketch of the Life of Major General Sir Isaac Brock

(Continued from last week)

His address to the people sounded no uncertain note. "We are engaged in an awful and eventful contest. By unanimity in our councils, and by vigor in our operations we may teach the country this lesson, that a country defended by freemen enthusiastically devoted to the cause of their king had constitution can never be conquered." This address was sent forth to the people by the legislative assembly. They expressed their joy at observing that the spirit of loyalty had burst forth in all its ancient splendor. At the ending of the legislature these words were spoken: "Preserve as have begun in your strict obedience of the law and your attention to the military discipline, deem no sacrifice too costly which secures the enjoyment of our happy constitution follow with your countrymen in Britain the paths of virtue and like them you shall triumph over all your unprincipled foes."

General Brock was moving energetically backward and forward between Fort George and the legislature at York, presiding at deliberations, writing dispatches to Quebec, sending detachments to outposts, negotiating with the Indians among whom he feared fickleness and disloyalty from the influence of American spies. He made no active demonstration on the river. He wrote: "Fort Niagara can be demolished when found necessary in half an hour, but to enable the militia to acquire some degree of discipline without interruption is of far greater consequence than such a conquest."

In heartfelt recognition of dependence on the dispenser of all events, in an age when such public recognition was rarer than it is now, General Brock early appointed a day of fasting and prayer for the success of the country's defense from the horror of successful invasion, in which the people of all creeds and classes joined and having taken this effectual means of success giving calmness and confidence to the excited people and inspiring them with the spirit of trustful courage, which is the best preparation for any trial he took care also not to neglect any of the more outward and tangible means of defense when the circumstances would permit and which his active mind and foresight could devise.

Long before the end of July hostilities had actually commenced in the far west. The British pluck and steadfastness was resisting the progress of the invaders among the marshes of the shores of Lake Huron. By General Brock's foresight, as early as May the 41st Regiment had been sent to Amherstburg or Fort Malden. He was almost in despair when on the 20th he received the information that General Hull had been since July 12th in possession of the Village of Sandwich. Colonel Proctor of the 41st and fresh detachment of troops and Militia were sent to the same quarter at Amherstburg. It was here that General Brock met the Shawnee Chief Tecumseh and where the two generals laid their plans of operation against the American force. This powerful chief had joined further west with the British leading 150 men, where they had victory at Michinimachinac, he now mustered 600 more from the west. He seemed impressed with General Brock's ability and courage at once, they seemed to take to each other instantly. Tecumseh was called the Noble Savage. He was rather light colored for an Indian complexion, an oval face, bright hazel eyes, a figure not tall but slender and finely proportioned. He wore no paint or beads. A deer skin costume seams with fringe, an eagle feather fastened in a red kerchief he wore around his head and on his feet moccasins richly embroidered. Around his neck, hanging by colored string of wampum, a large silver medalion of old King George III, which he said an ancestor of his had received from Lord Dorchester. He was clear hawk-eyed, that took in everything at a glance.

Platinum produced in Canada in 1926 totalled 9,521 fine ounces, or an increase of 1,000 over the year before, according to the Dominion Bureau of Statistics.

Dr. H. M. Tory, Chairman of the National Research Council, announces a discovery of great scientific importance in rust prevention, emanating from the Dominion Rust Laboratory. A more definite announcement is due shortly.

Canadian tobacco has been awarded a silver medal for "outstanding excellence" at the International Tobacco Exhibition held at Olympia, London, England, according to word received by the Department of Agriculture.

Fifteen Austrian families are about to take up land in the Okanagan Valley, near Kelowna being the first group to take up land in British Columbia under the Canada Colonization Association, a subsidiary of the Canadian Pacific Colonization Department.
