**CHANGING TIMES**

**Needed: A New "Bag of Tricks" for Business.**

The article in "System, The Magazine of Business," states that "A great deal is happening to-day in America that is not in the news in any definite way. There is a sort of undercurrent of feverish progress and experimentation. The motor industry seethes with rumors; in the floor-covering world we hear reports of a new type of carpet that may revolutionize that industry; a new era of consolidation looms; motion pictures are beginning to talk; chemical research is developing startling possibilities; the Secretary of Commerce is seen and heard by wire through the magic of television. Time and distance are being annihilated, with all that means in readjustment. All of this movement, this undercurrent of engineering and scientific progress is a threat to the security of the man who sits snugly by, feeling safe in his business or his industry. And it is matched by as much undercurrent progress in the public mind, which also has a definite bearing on business.

"It is going to require more ingenuity in the future to keep them interested, to keep a business prospering, than ever was needed before. Any man who thinks he has found a royal road to success and rests on his discovery is very likely to find his royal road abruptly turning into a dead-end street. Any business executive who does not closely follow the news of science, engineering, economics, and business these days, and keep constant watch of social developments, relating them in his mind constantly to his own business, is liable suddenly to find himself over in a backward eddy. On the other hand, alert business management, watchful of trends, quick to grasp new ideas and test them on a laboratory scale as possible additions to a 'bag of tricks,' will find the America and the Canada of the next few years mighty fine places in which to do business."

**Safety Notes from Quebec.**

- "Hogging the road," i.e., driving slowly and to the left of the right side of the road.
- Failure to slow down at intersections and such places.
- Passing another machine on its right and overtaking another machine on the right side.
- Leaving the curb, having just parked or stopped, without regard for and signals to passing traffic.
- All simple mistakes and common in Ontario. Paste them on your windshields where you can see them if you are an offender.

**The End of the German Monarchy.**

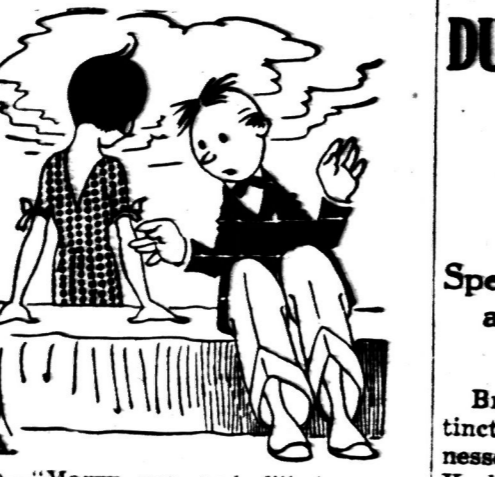
Frankfurt Zeitung: (The German Republican Doctrine Act, by which the German Government may take measures to prevent the return of the Kaiser, has become law.) Side by side with the 9th November, 1918, and the 11th August, 1918, the 17th May, 1927, will remain memorable in the history of the decline of the Monarchist Constitution in Germany. On the first of these dates the monarchy gave itself up by means of abdication. On the second it was legally abolished by the National Assembly. On the third it was timidly and feebly surrendered by the old Prussian Monarchist party itself. He who has eyes to see can after this day no longer believe that a return of the monarchy is possible in Germany.

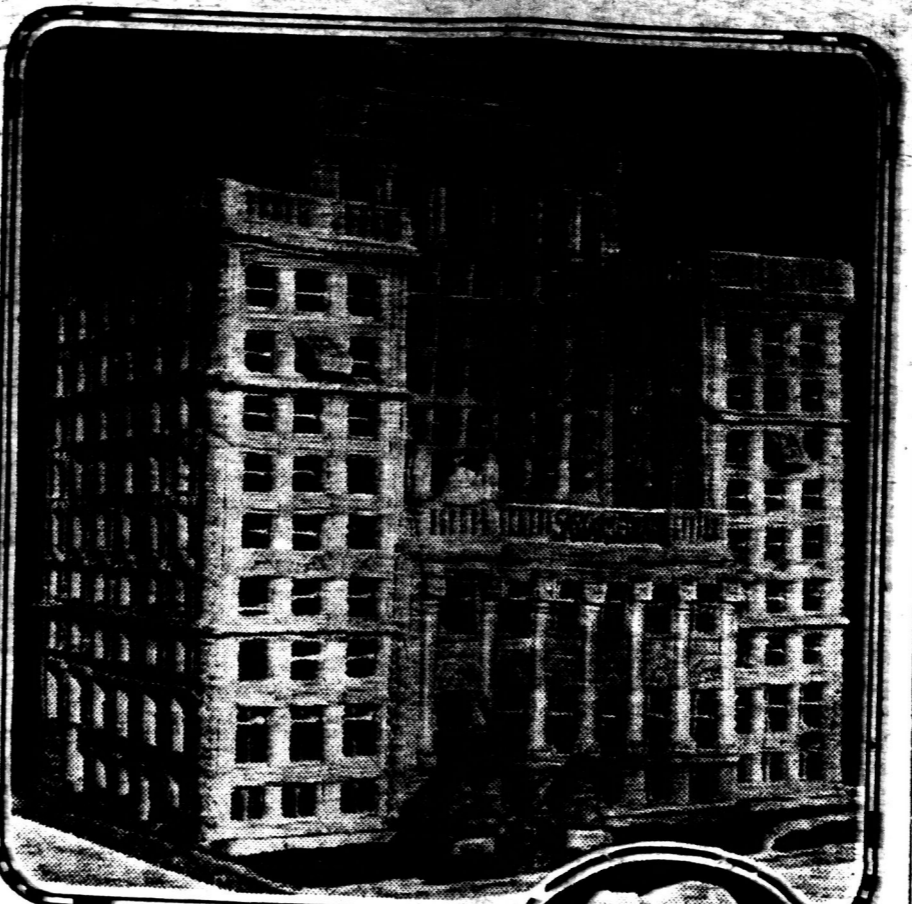

In the meanwhile we are and shall remain a tributary country to the United States. Our political liberty is of comparatively little importance to them; they are satisfied with their commercial supremacy and our economic dependence.

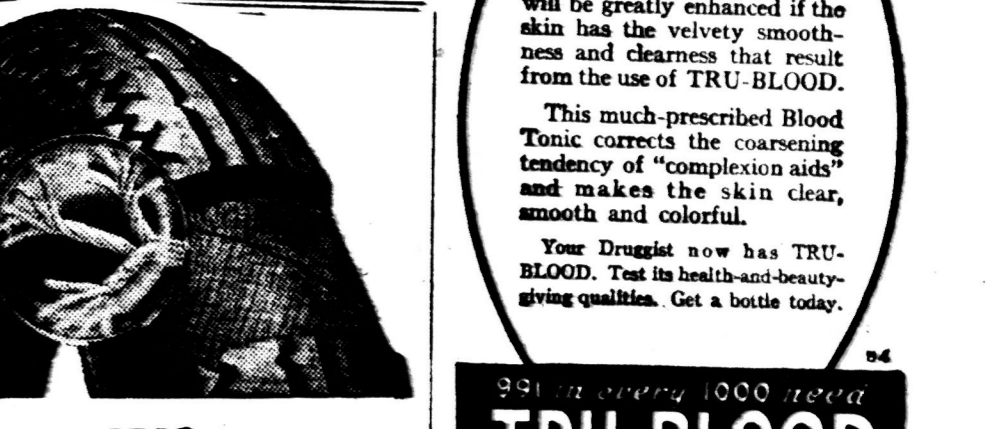
**ONTARIO READY**  
Proposes to Advertise Apples in Great Britain.

Hon. John S. Martin, Minister of Agriculture, states that the Ontario Government is prepared to co-operate with the Dominion Government in establishing a fund for the advertising of Canadian apples on British markets. P. W. Hodgett, head of the Fruits Branch of the Dept., will go to Ottawa on July 6 to attend a conference of fruit growers, apple shippers and various Provincial Government representatives on the whole advertising question.

It will be recalled that the last session of the Federal Parliament an amount of \$100,000 was appropriated for advertising purposes, Hon. James Malcom, Minister of Trade and Commerce, explaining that to the limit of that sum, on a dollar for dollar basis, the Federal Treasury would assist organized bodies of producers of food products in placing their commodities before the British buying public. Suggestions have been made to Mr. Malcom that at least \$20,000 of the appropriation be spent on advertising of Canadian apples. The proposal will be thoroughly threshed out at the coming Ottawa conference.

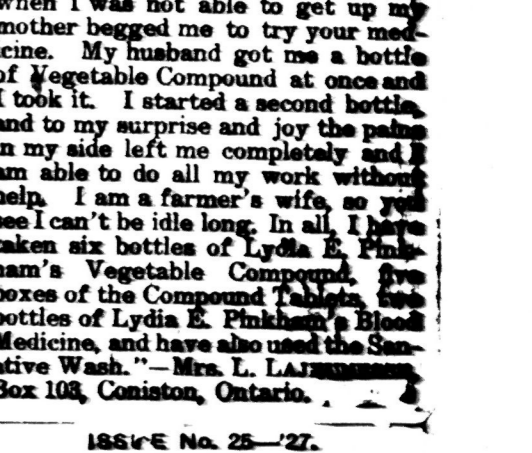
