BEAUTIFY THE HOME GROUNDS GOOD SHRUBS FOR THE FARM LAWN

Plant to have something attractive all the year, bloom and fragrance from the flowering shrubs during the spring and summer, colored fruit and foliage and twigs during the autumn and winter. Such flowering plants gelia, aithea and hydrangea give a as onions. wealth of bloom, while the sumachs and the barberry and the dogwood give a glorious coloring during the years ago. I plant the bulbs season when there is no bloom.

There are a few groups of shrubs fruit all winter. For colored twigs in paraffin wax and pack in a the Siberian dogwood and the golden box lined with oil paper. stemmed osier are most desirable.

FOUNDATION PLANTING. Of the shrugs bost suited for foundation planting the following are R. B. most desired: spirea Van Houttei. slender deutzia, callicarpa, snow- 000 acres and from imports of 15,000 berry, Japanese barberry, coralberry, bushels to an export of 60,000 Japanese privet, Forsythia, and bushels.

PLANTING DISTANCES. Tall shrubs such as the Lilac. Viburnum and Forsythia should be spaced 5 to 8 feet apart. This will feet apart, while medium height shrubs like Japanese privet, and spirea should be placed 4 to 5 feet apart. Do not crowd the plants too closely, give them room to grow and develop the shape characteristic for their importations.

quantity of planting material required for the foundation planting of medium-sized house:

- 2 Mugho pine 2 Japanese barberry
- 10 Regel's privet 6 Spirea Van Houttei
- Double white lilac 15 snowberry
- 6 Tartarian honeysuckle 3 Forsythia.

There are many other shrubs that can be used, perhaps to advantage. The list is given to indicate quantity, not what should be planted.

The Sport Corner. This is another stunt in which several people may hidden throughout the house and the participate. A line is drawn in chalk line with their hands, each side trying the line. The announcer has to describe the game play by play.

The Household Talk. This talk is a very brief description of the potato, given by the hostess herself.

In the dining room the table is ranged buffet style. The candid should be in the shape of potatoes. The cakes ca nbe made to look exactly like potatoes by cutting evals from thin sheets of sponge cake, putting two together with jelly or a soft icing, then icing them all over in caramel. Sprinkle very lightly with pulverized cinnamon and put in the 'eyes" with a sharp knife while the icing is still soft. Arrange the potato candies on a

plate and garnish with green lime candy leaves. A potato flour sponge cake may be served with these. Most realistic potato croquettes may be made by rolling cone-shaped servings of vanilla ice cream in very finely chopped nuts. Coffee or a fruit punch may be served also. Potato salad, potato chips, saltines and cheese crackers are suitable for a Mike party.

In the centre of the table should be either a loud speaker made of green cardboard or a square indoor aerial wound with green cord in place of wire.
