The main points brought out in this meeting were:

1. That it would be advisable to use for the basis of canvass the polling divisions rather than the school section (this idea was suggested by Harry Anderson) and that four canvassers be appointed for each polling division.

2. That suitable newspaper publicity be published in the six local papers in the county.

3. That the Secretary estimate the number of canvass forms required for the county and report to the Area Secretary who will then order the forms from R. W. Wade, Toronto.

4. That Mr. Ross Martindale secure a report from Ottawa re T. B. restricted area in stock yards in order that farmers or drovers who wish to buy cattle for feeding purposes could get them in this area at the stock yards and bring them into the restricted area without any loss of time or extra expense.

5. That in the selection of men on the township committees it should be kept in mind that beef men as well as dairy men and non-pure breeders as well as pure breeders be selected because the T. B. restricted area is for all classes of cattle and not for pure bred breeders only. It will benefit every cattle owner in the county and in the area.

6. That a special week be set aside in the county for canvass week and that it be known as "T. B. Restricted Area Canvass Week for Haldimand County." In all probability the week selected will be that of April 23rd.

7. That the next meeting be called at the discretion of the County Secretary, C. C. Main, and the Area Secretary, Ross Martindale.

The main objects of having the Niagara Peninsula declared a T. B. restricted area are:

1. To eradicate all diseased cattle from this area.
2. To prevent diseased animals from being brought into the area after it is once established as a restricted area. Special provision has been promised whereby feeders may be brought in by having an area of the stock yards a restricted area.

where cattle may be tested before being bought as feeders and taken into the restricted area. This does not in any way work out to the disadvantage of the country butcher. All the cattle selected would be free of disease and the butcher would not encounter the losses he does at present. Cattle for immediate slaughter, assigned to approved slaughter-houses only, may be brought into the area without test, but shall not be allowed to come into contact with other cattle and must be kept isolated on the premises until slaughtered. The country butcher will be in a better situation than he is at present because he would not have any losses from diseased carcasses.

Another advantage of the restricted area is that farmers would be encouraged to raise larger herds of cattle which would sell at a higher price because of the fact that they are free from disease. It would mean that buyers would come into the area for dairy cattle. This is especially true of American buyers. Since the T. B. restricted area was declared in Prince Edward County they have sold over \$10,000 worth of dairy cattle. It also would mean that fluid milk and all dairy products would possibly bring a higher price than is realized at present because of the fact that the milk would be free from the dreaded disease, T. B.

The two main lines of argument which should be kept in mind when voting on this important subject are:

1. The protection of the farmer's own children from infection with T. B.
2. The requirements of city health authorities in enforcing the test. These requirements affect both the market for milk and that for dairy cattle.

3. It is also time that there was a general cleanup of stables not only for city milk supply but for cheese and butter factory patrons.

Meetings will be held in each township for the purpose of thoroughly acquainting farmers with the T. B. restricted area project, and the farmers should be prepared, after giving the matter careful consideration, to tell the canvassers when they wait on them whether or not they are in favor of having their cattle tested for T. B. and of having the Niagara Peninsula declared a T. B. restricted area.

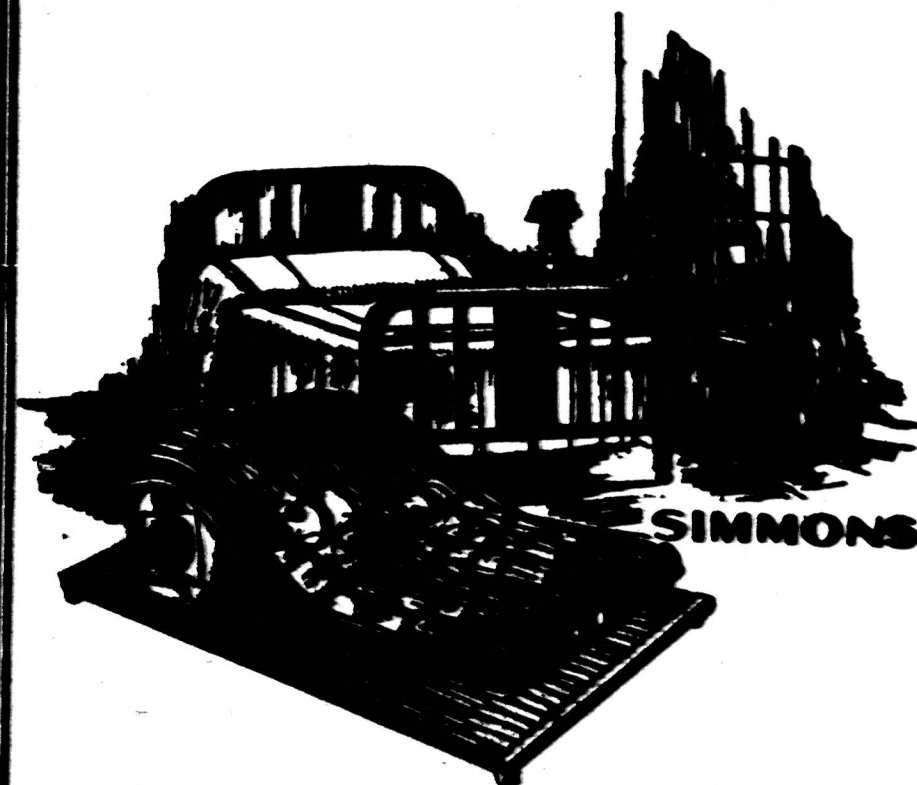
