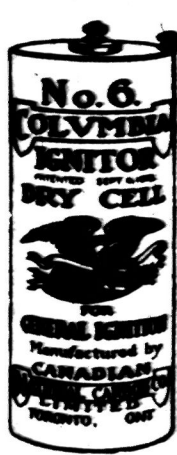

GOOD ROADS COMMITTEE REPORT

1. We have examined the pay lists and accounts submitted by the Superintendent, and recommend that they be paid.

2. Would recommend that the tender from Standard Steel Construction Company of Welland, Ont., for steel superstructure, Dennis bridge, Road 11, be accepted. Amount \$6250.

3. The macadam base on Road 11, from Rainham Centre to Norfolk line, length 1 1/2 miles, will be completed on September 1st.

Would recommend that the chairman of this committee and the Superintendent be authorized to sell any buildings in the county quarries that are not required.

A bylaw was finally passed appointing Lewis Ricker of Canboro as Inspector under The Corn Borer Act, R.S.O. 1927, Chapter 312 — the inspector to be paid \$7.00 per day for each day he is engaged in his work — he to supply his own car and pay all travelling expenses; and that the Inspector may, with the written approval of the Warden, engage one or more assistants at critical times, and that such assistants shall be paid at the rate of \$5.00 per day for each day they are engaged in the work, they to supply their own cars and pay all travelling expenses.

COMMITTEE OF THE WHOLE REPORT

Was adopted as follows:

1. That Lewis Ricker be appointed Corn Borer Inspector.

2. That the letter from Department of Highways, re widening the County roads to 66 feet, be filed with Clerk.

3. That the letter from the County Clerk, re bridges of over 20 ft. in width on County lines be placed under County Road Superintendent, be filed.

4. That same prizes as last year be granted for annual Live Stock Competition.

5. That the usual grant of \$500.00 be made to the District Agricultural Representative.

6. That James S. Waddell be paid \$4.00 in full for his claim, and if this is not accepted that the County Solicitor be instructed to defend the action.

7. That the claim of Hamilton hospital for maintenance of Vivian Jones be disputed.

8. That the letter from Hospital for Sick Children be filed with Clerk.

9. That Alex Bradley and wife be appointed Manager and Matron of the Haldimand House of Refuge.

10. That we advertise for a physician for the House of Refuge—applications to be made to the Chairman of Home Committee.

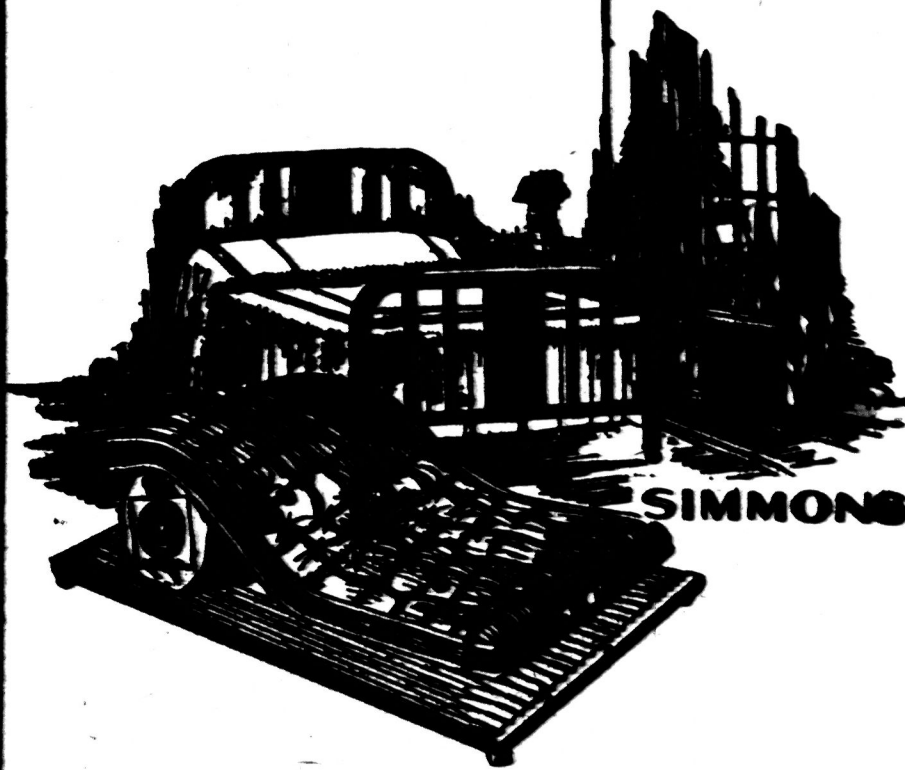
