Dogs That Do Their Duty

The first city in the world to install dogs as regular members of the police force was the quaint old city of Ghent, Belgium, observes The Pathfinder. Years ago the chief of police of Ghent pointed out to the governing authorities that a cleverly trained dog could run down a criminal more surely and quickly than any two-legged policeman, and that it was better to risk a dog's life rather than that of an officer. The idea found favor and the chief was commissioned to get his dogs. This he did and trained them to distinguish between shuffling criminals and the ordinary reputable citizen, who walks by day. Special kennels were built in the police stations, and collars, coats and muzzles were provided in the way of uniforms. The dogs proved particularly useful to the police at night and saved much running backwards and forwards. These dogs are so highly intelligent that they refuse food from strangers, bring home lost children, etc. Many of them are so anxious to get a "case" that they will follow and look askance at a person of suspicious appearance. The idea proved such a success that other municipalities have followed the example of Ghent.

Immigration to Canada
Ottawa, Canada—Immigration to Canada for the first nine months of the current fiscal year, ending December 31, 1927, totalled 128,928, an increase over the corresponding period in 1926 of 14,893 or 13 per cent. Of the total of 128,928, the immigration of British, United States, French, Belgian, Swiss, Scandinavian, Dutch, or German origin amounted to 92,955. In the nine months under review 33,722 Canadians returned to live in the Dominion from the United States where they had gone with the declared intention of residing there permanently.
Immigration during the month of December, 1927, totalled 4,566 of which 937 were British, 1,254 from the United States, and 2,345 from other countries.

Radio in Russia

Ten New Stations Opened; Biggest Plant is at Moscow; Has 40,000 Watts Power
Washington.—Although Russia was excluded from the International Radio Telegraph Conference, in which seventy-seven nations participated, reports indicate the Soviet government is leading the world, outside of the United States, in radio development. Recent changes in the broadcast field have been most striking in the case of Russia, where ten new stations have been established, Lawrence D. Batton, of the electrical equipment division of the Department of Commerce for the U.S. declares. Of fifty-nine stations in Europe which are operating on wave-lengths of 550 meters and higher thirty-one are in Russia.

A large majority of the stations in Russia are operated by local Soviets and labor unions, which are employing radio extensively in disseminating Communist documents and education. The big 40,000-watt station at Moscow is owned by the government, while the 19,000-watt station at Leningrad is operated by a broadcasting company.

It is reported that passenger trains running between Moscow and Leningrad will be equipped soon with radio telephones.

The world has continued to increase its broadcasting facilities during the last few months until there are now 441 broadcasting stations in foreign countries. Europe has 202; North America, outside of the United States, 129; South America, fifty-two; Asia, twenty-two; Oceania, twenty-seven, and Africa, seven.
