

We wish to draw the attention of our readers to the fact that the Ont. Government, through the Forestry Branch, has for distribution this year ten million forest trees. These are to be used for reforesting waste areas The highest average cost is found of the Province, and it is expected that at least three-quarters of them will be used by private individuals throughout Ontario for reforesting waste areas of the farm and for the planting of windbreaks. The Government scheme at present provides that any resident of the Province may secure 3,500 trees free for reforesting its to Schools. 
