Dublin.-President William T. Cosgrave, returning from a tour of Canada and the United States, came home on Saturday after a boisterous crossing, amid the booming salute of cannon and the cheers of thousands. A fleet of airplanes met his ship at sea and escorted it to the Kingstown Pier. where a salute of nineteen guns rang

His triumphal entrance into Dublin was made by the ancient southern gateway on Leeson Street, where Queen Victoria was once received on a visit to Ireland. Here a mounted guard of honor clattered out and led the procession of thousands of torchbearers, who, with bands and banners, escorted the President to the Gres-


