 Hagersville.

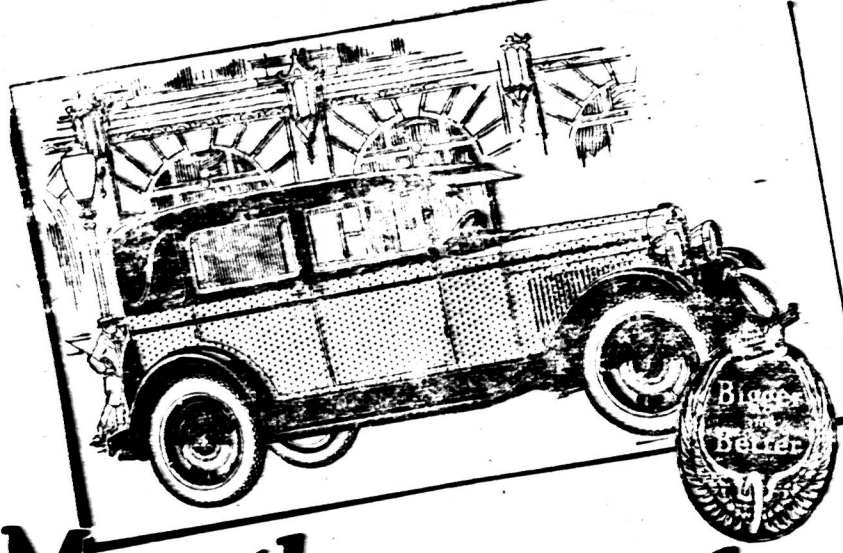

 am Irish, too."



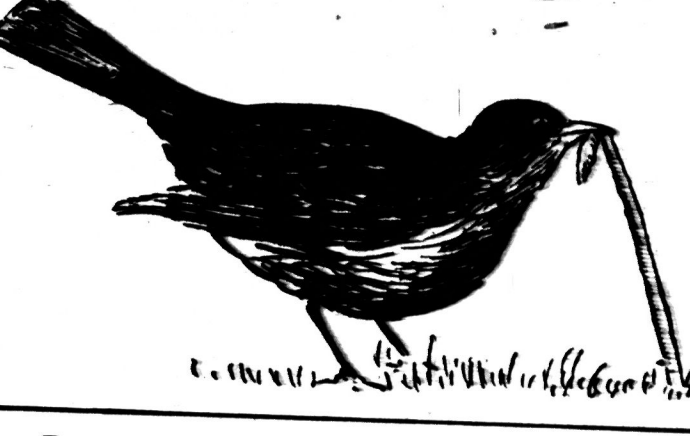

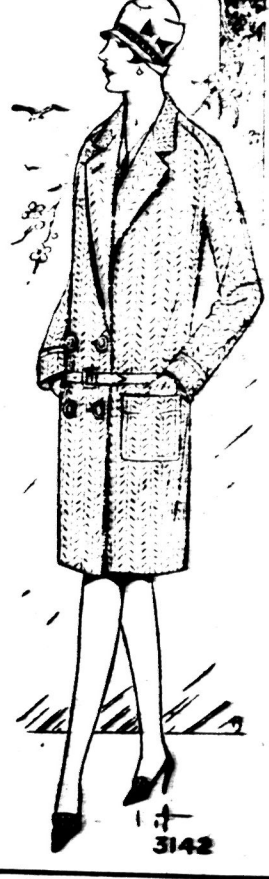

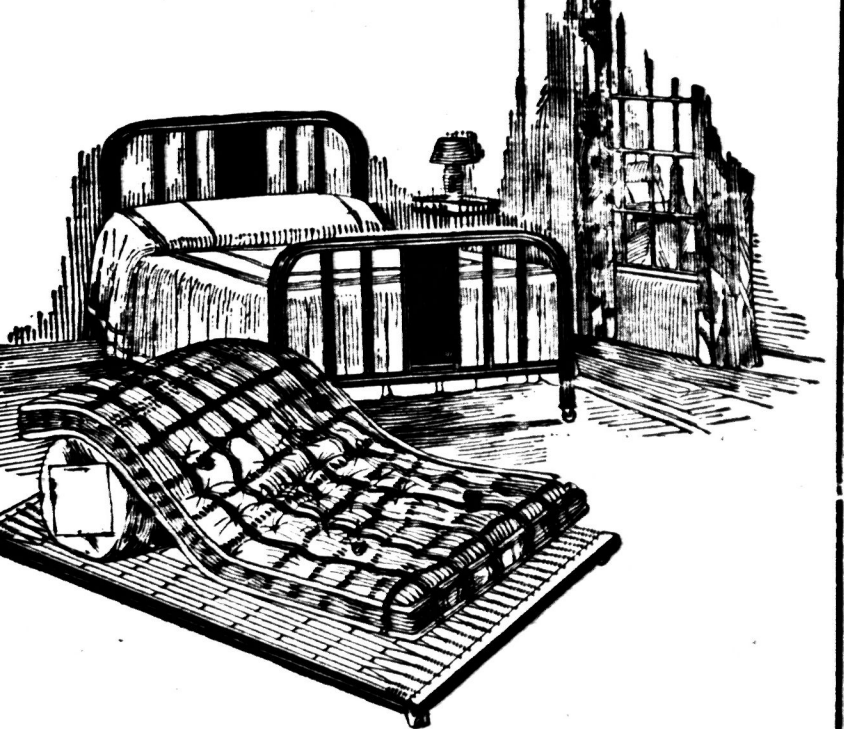
