Leave was granted to introduce a bylaw to put the road leading from Willow Grove west to the Indian Reservation on the County Road System and was finally passed.
GOOD ROADS REPORT
Was adopted as follows:
Gentlemen—Your Good Roads Committee beg leave to report as follows:
1. We have examined the pay lists and accounts submitted by the Superintendent and recommend that they be paid.
2. Would recommend that Melvin Runchey be appointed Traffic Officer for the County Highways System at a remuneration of \$5 per day, including car service, duties to commence on the 7th day of March, 1928, and continue until May 1st, 1928.
3. Would recommend that Mr. Gilmore be given a contract for crushing and delivering stone on Road No. 11, from Norfolk Line to Chesapeake Side-road. Amount required, approximately 8000 yards and also that Mr. A. Best be given a contract for 3000 cu. yards of stone on Road No. 11 and No. 12, providing their prices are satisfactory to the committee.
4. Would recommend that the Sawyer Massey crusher at Kimmert's quarry and all equipment necessary to operate a quarry that is stored there be offered for sale to Mr. Best for the sum of \$1800. Terms, \$900 on the 1st day of October 1928, and the balance on October 1st, 1929, with interest at 6 per cent. per annum.
5. Would recommend that marked cheque, given by Mr. Gilbertson as bond for completion of contract on Road No. 5, be returned to him. The amount \$2,000.
6. Would recommend that the committee be given power to enter into a contract with Mr. Gilmore, and Mr. A. Best, to deliver crushed stone on roads No. 11 and 12, providing the price is satisfactory.

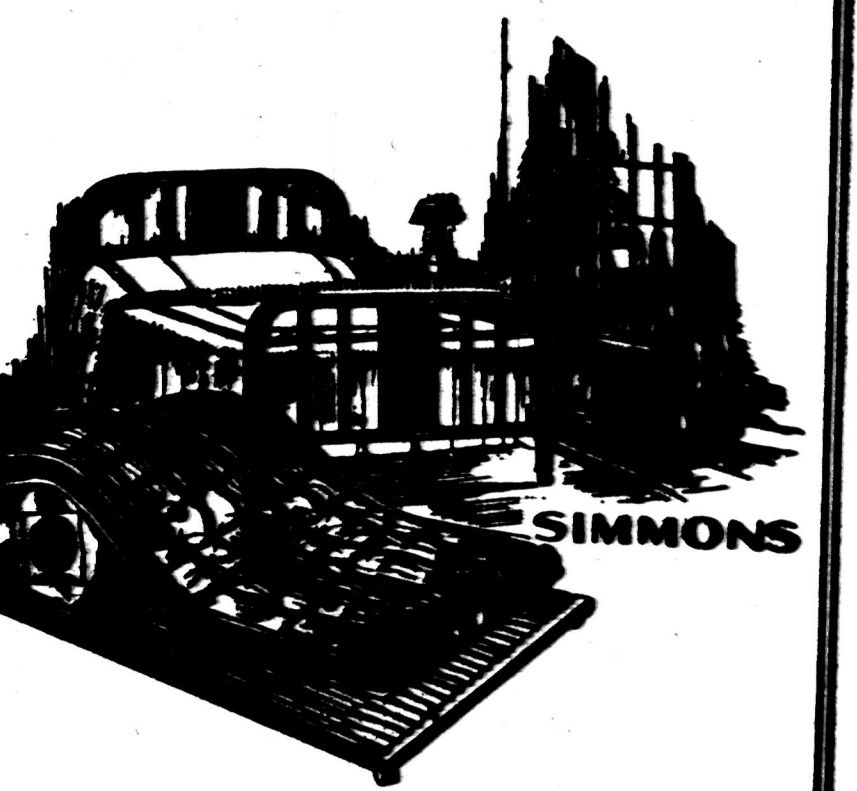
