GO-TO-SUNDAY-SCHOOL- DAY, SUNDAY, MAY 13

The events of recent years have placed a new and enlarged emphasis upon the tremendous importance of the religious education of childhood and youth. We have been forced to recognize that our civilization can stand only as it rests upon strong moral and religious foundations. To secure Christian character and Christian living our secular education must be supplemented by religious education. We may well rejoice that never perhaps in its history has the Church given itself with more earnestness and purpose to this task than it is doing at the present time.

In order that special attention may be directed to the place and value of the Sunday School and the ever enlarging service it is rendering, the second Sunday in May is set apart each year and called Go-to-Sunday-School Day. This year the day falls on May 13th, when all, both young and old, are asked to take part in the exercises of the Sunday School. Since that day is also observed as Mother's Day, all are asked to "honor Mother" by going to Sunday School on Mother's Day.

A special program of exceptional worth has been prepared for use in the Sunday Schools by the Ontario Religious Education Council. This is the agency through which the Sunday School Boards of the various churches co-operate in promoting the work of religious education throughout the Province. Some idea of the extent of its work can be gathered from the fact that it gives leadership each year to upwards of 250 district conventions, promotes church vacation schools, directed last year 24 boys' camps and 20 girls' camps, four Leadership Training Summer Schools and Community Standard Training Schools in no less than 49 different centers. This is but a part of the splendid service the O.R.E.C. is rendering. It is worthy of the loyal and generous support of all who are concerned with the religious welfare of our boys and girls.

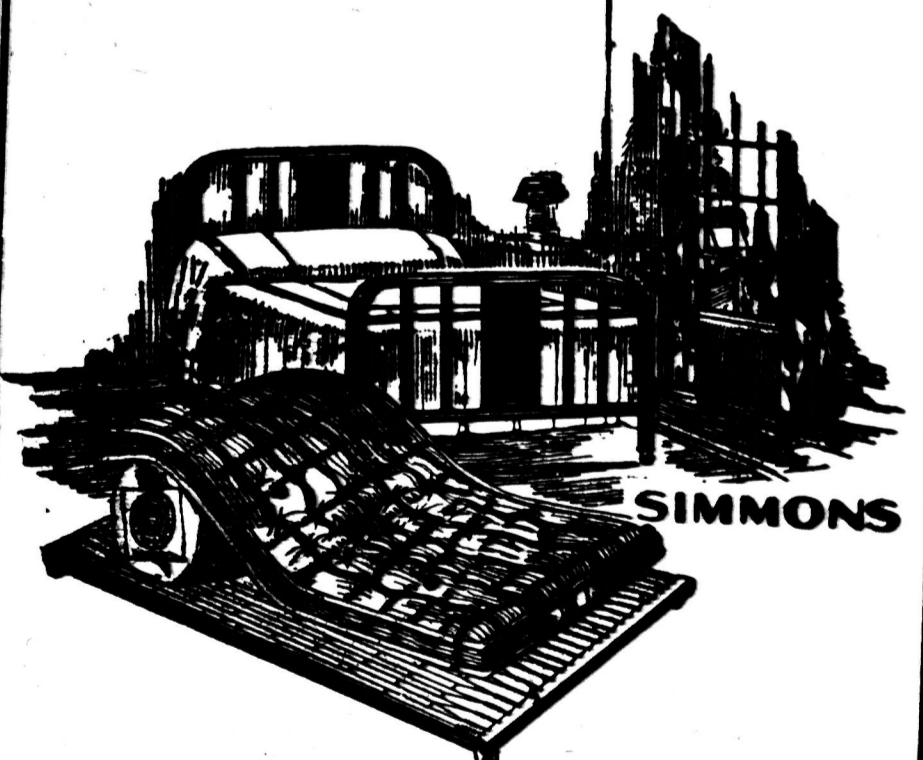
