

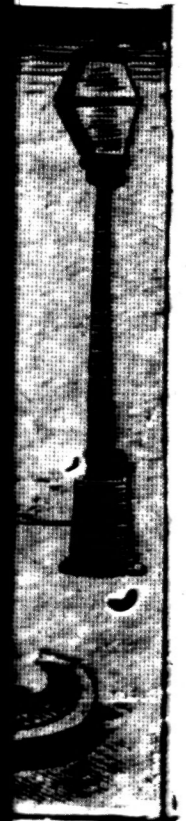
Our Farm Into a Palace

Using Detached Grapes

One of the best ways to utilize detached grapes that are often found loose in the bottom of a grape basket is to serve them as one does olives, radishes and other relishes. They may be set in a bed of chopped ice in a small glass dish or occupy one of the divisions of an assorted relish dish.
