HEALTH HINTS By Mrs. C. Erwin

A SICK ROOM

The ideal sick room is so rare in the experience of the physician, that it is well worth while for the nurse to make every effort towards its attainment. The nurse's conception of the ideal sick room must embrace more than the room alone. It must include the appointment, the management and the nurse herself. You will seldom find all that is to be desired in the room and its belongings, therefore you can make up for what is lacking by your management, by your tact, by your ability to make the best out of even the worst condition, and above all by your personality. You as a nurse are the directing and controlling spirit of the ideal sick room.

The five essentials of the sick room are: cleanliness, regularity, cheerfulness, ventilation and light. The room should be as far as possible from the street, the kitchen and living rooms, that the patient may not be disturbed by noise or odors. In case of contagious disease the room should be in the upper part of the house, for there it is easier to secure isolation of the patient; here also the air is pure and the air currents being mostly upward, are likely to spread infection to the members of the household or the outer world.

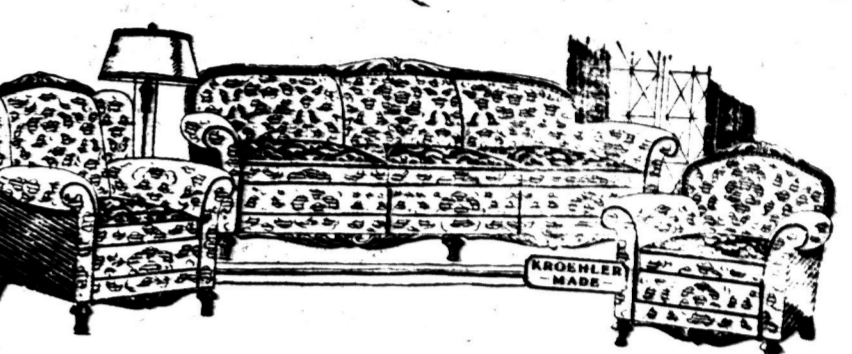
THE OCTOBER ROD AND GUN and Canadian Silver Fox News
