HEALTH HINTS By Mrs. C. Erwin

CARE OF THE BED

The bed must receive the most constant and careful attention, for perhaps by nothing she does is the nurse nore critically judged than by her skill in making a bed. To a healthy and tired individual it may be a small matter whether it be well made, but to an invalid, condemned to weeks of confinement, it is of most importarce. A narrow iron bedstead on eastors is to be preferred in sickness. A patient, if helpless, can be much mere easily cared for upon a high bed than a low one. Use a hair or felt mattress with wire springs, if it be possible. A feather bed should never be used in sickness, it is too heating to the patient, and if they are restless they will soon make it a perfect hen's nest. You cannot make it up comfortable without disturbing the patient for it will lump up: also the odor of perspiration you cannot air out of it when in conscant use.

Bedding-The sheets should be of cetton or linen; 21/2 to 3 yards long and of sufficient width to tuck in under the mattress and firmed so the patient will have no wrinkles to lie upon. The covering on the bed should be light weight, light color and of a kind that can be easily washed and done up. Blankets of light weight wool or cotton of light color are better than quilts, for if soiled the fact can readily be noted. If possible, use no bedding that cannot be washed and boiled if necessary. A heavyweighted covering should not be put upon a patient. Feverishness is semetimes a symptom of fever and sometimes of bedcloths.

Keep the room at an even temperature, 68 degrees. If the patient is cold provide extra warmth by hot water bottle or other means of external heat if sufficient covering is
