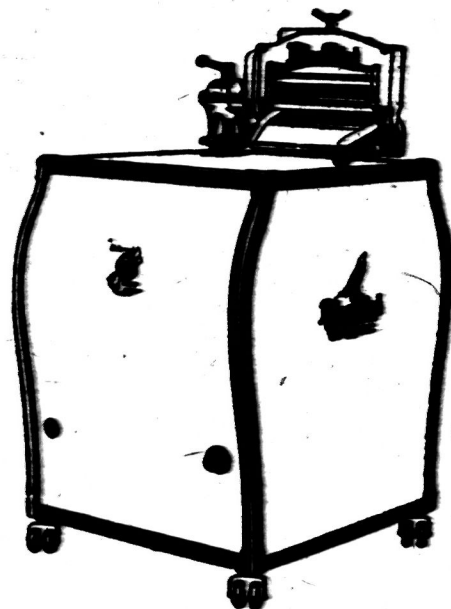

expenses and \$5,000 for Gold Bonds on credit obtained from the Caledonia Bank of Commerce.

Advised to sign and submit to the Minister of Public Works and Highways

of the Province of Ontario the petition of the Corporation of the County of Haldimand, showing that during the period January 1st, 1922, to December 31, 1922, there has been expended upon the County Highway System, and County Boundary Bridge as the sum of \$133,198.51, and requesting statutory grants on that amount as provided by the Act to aid in the improvement of Public Highways.

A bylaw was passed authorizing the issue of debentures for \$20,000 bearing interest at 5% per annum to pay part of the share of the County to the Province for the construction of the bridge over the Grand River at Caledonia. The said debentures to be dated the 20th instant and to be repayable in 20 equal annual amounts of \$1,004.85.

A bylaw was passed making grant of \$700 to the Children's Aid Society of Haldimand, payable quarterly by the first payment to be made at once, and the others on the 30th day of June, September and December respectively.

Jepson-Kett—That whereas in the opinion of this Council it would be in the interests of efficiency and good management if all gaol officials in the Province were placed on the Ontario Civil Service List—the same as other Government officials.

1. Therefore be it resolved that in our opinion all gaol officials in the Province should be placed on the Ontario Civil Servants List.

2. And that necessary legislation be passed so that permanent officers of Ontario gaols, when obliged to retire from office either through old age or disability, will be eligible to receive an annual superannuation allowance. Carried.
