## REV. R. D. HAMILTON

The death of Rev. R. D. Hamilton,  
who passed away at his late home  
on the Pepper farm, three miles west  
of Springfield, Ont., on Sunday even-  
ing, February 17th, has caused a great  
sorrow among the people of the Unit-  
ed church in Western Ontario, where  
he labored earnestly for so many  
years and was widely known through-  
out Western Ontario. He was 70  
years of age, having been born at  
Strathmore, in Wentworth County, in  
1858, son of the late Capt. John Ham-  
ilton of the Wentworth Militia. He  
attended Dundas Grammar school, la-  
ter studying for the Methodist minis-  
try. Mr. Hamilton subsequently was  
ordained at Vienna, Brownsville,  
Springfield, Dutton, Fingal, Ft. Steu-  
ley, Alvinston, Kingsville, Colborne  
street church of London, Petrolia, Lis-  
town, Brantford, St. Catharines and  
Burlington, being superannuated from  
the latter place five years ago.

In the course of his career as a  
minister, Mr. Hamilton held the of-  
fice of President of the Hamilton  
Conference of the Methodist church.

Mrs. Hamilton, whose passing was  
very sudden, died six years  
ago, and a son, Douglas, was killed  
while serving overseas with the Cana-  
dian forces in the Great War. She  
leaving a daughter, Miss M., re-  
siding at home, a son, Richard E.,  
merchant at Aylmer; two brothers,  
Edward of Preston and Henry of  
Dundas; two sisters, Mrs. Davidson of  
Hamilton and Mrs. Knight of Troy,  
Wentworth County. The late Mrs. W.  
J. Bigger of Walsby, who died some  
years ago, was also a sister.

Only a few months ago Mr. Ham-  
ilton attended and assisted Rev. P. E.  
Dreth at the funeral of his brother-  
in-law, Mr. W. J. Bigger of Walsby,  
and the Bigger family here mourn the  
loss of a very affectionate and loving

son.  
Mr. Hamilton took a very active  
part in preparing the county war cen-  
tral at Aylmer and at the annual  
meeting of the Ontario Association of  
Methodist Ministers in December, 1926, he  
acted as a delegate from which he did  
not return.

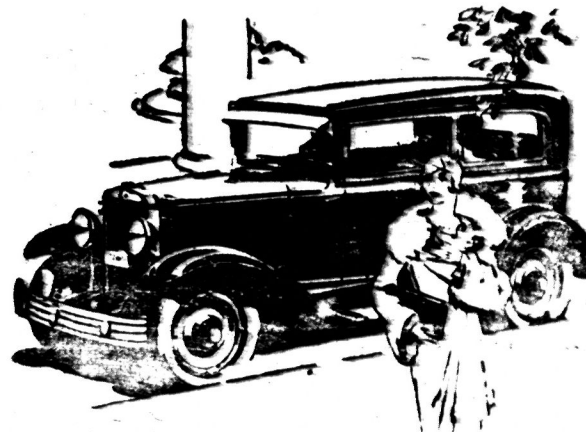
Mr. Hamilton has preached in Ju-
