

## Radio Crime Net for Whole State Proposed in Bill

Radio will be called into state-wide use to aid crime control by authorizing the law violator who seeks escape by the speed of the automobile, it is planned if a bill just filed in the Massachusetts Legislature is enacted. The bill proposes to require every city and town police headquarters in the State to install a receiving set, to pick up broadcasting from the new low-wave radio-casting station of the State Department of Public Safety.

According to its sponsors the measure would make Massachusetts the first state to inaugurate radio police communication on such a broad scale. A present, General Foster said, when it is desired to spread an alarm, an officer must sit at the telephone and repeat the story time after time on a series of long distance calls and the process is so slow that a criminal in a fast motor car frequently may keep ahead of the warnings.

The proposed method is already in use for communication from the department headquarters in the State House to barracks of the state police in many parts of the State. Jesse F. Stevens, adjutant-general of the Massachusetts National Guard, pointed out that the system would be of great value in emergency and relief work, being used in connection with the portable radio transmitting sets of the national guard to establish communication with areas which might be isolated by storms or floods.

Commissioner Wilson, who already is enthusiastic over the results of use of the teletype communication system, installed a year ago to connect the 22 Boston police divisions, said he would favor installation of radio receiving sets not only in the Boston headquarters but also at every division station. We understand a similar system is under consideration in Toronto for Ontario use.


