Production of agricultural implements and machinery in Canada amounted to \$42,996,288 in 1927, according to the Bureau of Statisties, as compared with \$38,269.214 for the previous year and \$24,776,-216 for 1925. Of the 65 firms reporting, 43 were in Ontario, 12 in Quebec, 4 in Manitoba, 4 in Alberta, one in Saskatchewan and one in Prince Edward Island.
