### A LETTER OF THANKS AND EXPLANATION

To the Electors and Citizens of Jarvis:  
As I was not at the nomination  
meeting on Friday night last and un-  
derstand since, I have caused some  
disappointment by not accepting the  
nomination tendered me at that meet-  
ing for the position of councilman for  
the year 1929, I take this privilege  
of extending my sincere thanks to the  
nover and seconder of my nomination  
and also to those who voluntarily of-  
fered me their support and good wish-  
es. In the way of an explanation,  
why I did not accept the nomination  
and qualify, I felt sure the majority  
of the electors would agree with me,  
that it would be a mistake to put our  
village to the expense of another elec-  
tion to fill the one seat in the council.  
Money is very much needed and can  
be used in a great number of ways in  
making a better and a more up-to-  
date village, which would add to the  
comfort and pride of us all. As I  
have been a resident and ratepayer  
in the village ever since its incorpora-  
tion and almost a life-long citizen of  
this vicinity, I feel loyal and very  
proud of our village. With its school  
churches, paved streets lined with  
beautiful shade trees and beautiful  
well kept up homes, etc., it will com-  
pare with any other village of its size  
in Canada, leads me to think it is just  
as necessary to have good men with  
as much municipal experience as pos-

sible, to handle the affairs of our vil-  
lage as it is in the larger places.  
Therefore, I felt myself very weak,  
as well as lacking the experience for  
such work. But on the other hand, I  
think we all should pull together in  
trying to make a better Jarvis. For  
my part I would like to see in the  
future our council comprised of not  
less than three experienced men who  
would be preparing themselves and be  
capable of filling the reeve's chair  
when their turn came. This would  
give room for one or two new men in  
the council each year, which would be  
the means of creating more interest  
in the affairs of our village and also  
giving our boys a chance to try their  
hand at the job. By having an elec-  
tion once in a while, at the right  
time is quite proper, as it gives the  
electors a chance to show who they  
want to continue in office, also giv-  
ing more honor to those elected. The  
only way to know whether you are  
the electors' choice or not. For a  
job without salary and always a cer-  
tain amount of criticism needs all the  
honor that is coming our way. But  
there is also a business and duty to  
be carried on by our council, which  
means something to us all and to  
handle it successfully will show any  
councilman that his office is not a  
joke or bouquet of honors. I believe  
any ex-councilman will say that one  
of the hardest jobs is to keep up with  
all the necessary improvements and  
not increase our taxes and make a

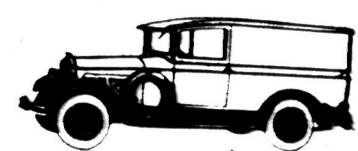
