It is also true in our human experience that there are diseases of the body which the min i, even though depending in strong faith upon God, cannot heal. Nevertheless, faith conquers the disability, rejoices in God's redeeming love, and in his forgiving grace, and endures in hope of immortality and eternal life. In the highest and truest sense the man of faith may, with the psalmist, say to his soul, He healeth all thy diseases; he redeemeth thy life from destruction. And he bears upon his uplifted brow as a wreath or crown the lovingkindness and tender mercies of God.

The meaning of v. 5 is not quite certain. The Hebrew word rendered "mouth" is rendered in the ancient Greek version "desire." So Moffatt translates, perhaps correctly: "He gives you all your heart's desire,




