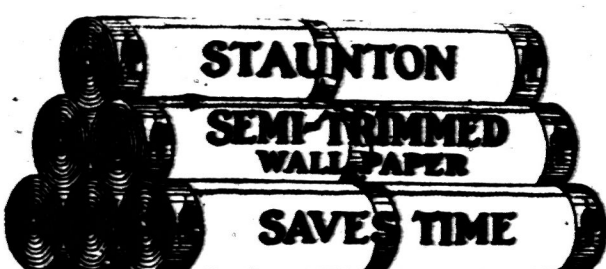

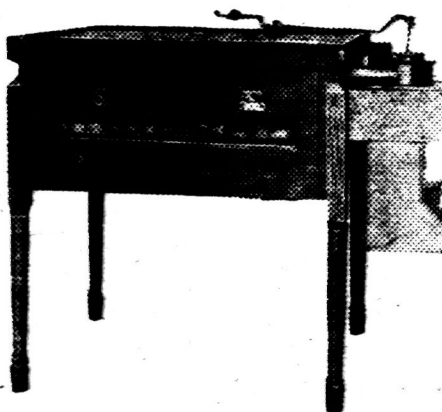

Kett-Hyslop—That we of the County Council of the County of Haldimand are very glad indeed that the Dominion Natural Gas Company are to have a coke plant erected at some port on the north shore of Lake Erie. This plant will certainly be a worth while contribution to the vast industrial expansion which is now taking place in this great country of ours. We, as Canadians, are very optimistic as to the future of our country, as are many from other countries, judging from the capital from the United States and European countries which is being invested here.

The erection of a coke plant at any port on the north shore of Lake Erie will certainly be a boon to that particular community, and a stimulus for further industrial growth. It is only natural that groups of interested citizens from every town along the Canadian shore of Lake Erie would be setting forth the particular advantages of their port for the location of this plant.

We are very glad indeed to hear of the very pleasant and courteous reception which the delegation, comprising members of the town council and chamber of commerce of the Town of Dunville, received when laying before you the many advantages of Port Maitland as a possible location for this coke plant, and there are many reasons which we in our humble way feel that Port Maitland, which is the only lake port of Haldimand County, should be the logical location for this plant.

1. Because of the large investment which your company already has made in our county, and the role which Haldimand County has played in the success and progress of the Dominion Natural Gas Company, due to being the main source of supply of natural gas in the past as well as at the present time, and we hope in the future.

2. That the nearness of Port Maitland to what we believe to be the ultimate market for the coke, as well as the gas, viz., the entire Niagara Peninsula, which is now enjoying greater industrial expansion than any other section of Ontario.

3. That superiority of Port Maitland over any other port on the north shore of Lake Erie, due to accessibility, greater depth of water and rail boat service generally.

4. The freight rates being much cheaper from this port to the markets referred to than from any other port along Lake Erie, and the advantage of the lower cost of coal which will probably be used in the manufacture of gas, which favors this port.

5. And last but not least, we have always enjoyed the splendid service which the Dominion Natural Gas Co. has given to the residents of the towns and villages, as well as many rural districts throughout the county. Because of the best of co-operation and fair play which we have received from the Dominion Natural Gas Co. and which we feel has been reciprocated, and thus in view of the above we trust that Port Maitland will receive due consideration.
