THE RECORDS OF PROVINCIAL AND LOCAL HEALTH BOARDS PROVE ABUNDANTLY THAT SMALLPOX IS TAKEN BY THOSE WHO ARE UNPROTECTED BY VACCINATION AND THAT THOROUGH SYSTEMATIC AND FREQUENTLY REPEATED VACCINATION WILL STAMP OUT SMALLPOX FROM A COMMUNITY AND PREVENT ANY EPIDEMIC OF THE DISEASE.

FOR THE PROTECTION OF ITS CITIZENS THE PROVINCE OF ONTARIO HAS ENACTED LAWS WITH RESPECT TO VACCINATION AND THE ISOLATION OF CASES OF SMALLPOX.

Rules for the Control and Prevention of Smallpox

1. If possible, the patient should be removed at once to an isolation hospital to prevent the spread of the disease by infection. This disease should be given the same care as of diphtheria in the ordering of taking care of the sickroom and the prevention of anything being brought in to the room or taken out of the room, as nothing should be given to the patient that cannot be destroyed after recovery or death. Door cracks and keyholes communicating with other rooms should be sealed by pasting over them strips of wrapping paper; a sheet moist with carbolic or bichloride solution should be hung from the top of the door. The floor, woodwork and furniture should be frequently wiped with cloth moistened with disinfectant solution.

2. Only those who have been recently vaccinated should act as attendant and attendant must not come in contact with other people. Permanent immunity from smallpox, however, can only be acquired by a successful primary vaccination, as a result of which a typical vesicle and well-marked characteristic scar is developed and by re-vaccinations repeated at intervals of not more than five years.

3. All scales and fragments of skin from the patient's body should be carefully collected and burned by the attendant. The windows in the sick-room should always be open and there should be an open fire, if possible. No public funeral services, or other gatherings can be held in a house in which there is a case of smallpox.

HEALTH HINTS

SMALLPOX

Smallpox is a communicable and preventable disease. It is contracted by direct contact or by exposure to emanations from the bodies of persons sick with the disease or to articles used by them or exposed in their vicinity and on which the emanations have alighted. Smallpox is most contagious while the eruption is in active progress, but it is also contagious before the eruption appears.

The records of provincial and local health boards prove abundantly that smallpox is taken by those who are unprotected by vaccination and that thorough systematic and frequently repeated vaccination will stamp out smallpox from a community and prevent any epidemic of the disease.

FOR THE PROTECTION OF ITS CITIZENS THE PROVINCE OF ONTARIO HAS ENACTED LAWS WITH RESPECT TO VACCINATION AND THE ISOLATION OF CASES OF SMALLPOX.

Rules for the Control and Prevention of Smallpox

1. If possible, the patient should be removed at once to an isolation hospital to prevent the spread of the disease by infection. This disease should be given the same care as of diphtheria in the ordering of taking care of the sickroom and the prevention of anything being brought in to the room or taken out of the room, as nothing should be given to the patient that cannot be destroyed after recovery or death.
