Why Work For Worms? Warble Injury Costs Ontario Stock Men \$7,000,000 Annually

Losses due to cattle parasites in Ontario amount to a large sum each year. This should not be so, as our climate is an ideal one for live stock and not a particularly favorable one for the lower forms of life that are parasitic on our domestic animals.

During the four months, April, May, June and July, 75% of the cattle hides going to the markets are grub-infested and can only make third grade sales of leather. This loss to Canada has been estimated at \$7,000,000. Ontario's share in this loss would be about one-third of that amount.
