HEALTH HINTS

GONORRHEAL INFECTION

Gonorrhea is a contagious inflammation with a purulent discharge (Gould) and is due to the germ gonococcus. The infection is as widespread as syphilis and its effects are less destructive. It explains most cases of inflammation of the eyes of the new-born (ophthalmia neonatorum) and the blindness of infants, and serious trouble or disorders in grownups. Systematic infection usually follows the primary stage of infection and may manifest itself in endocarditis (heart trouble), peritonitis, abscesses, blood-poisoning, as ptomaine poisoning, and gonorrhoeal arthritis. Men are more frequently affected by systematic infection than women.

Gonorrhoeal arthritis is an inflammation of a joint due to gonococcus. Sometimes it is called gonorrhoeal rheumatism or syphilitic rheumatism. When the infection gains access to a joint it may cause a temporary attack or the disease may become chronic and last for years. In chronic cases the disorder may progress very rapidly and leave the patient more helpless than in arthritis deformans. Usually only one joint is affected, but as a rule when one joint and most often in a large joint, is affected other joints will be affected and the inflammation does not subside as occurs in acute rheumatism. An pleurisy may develop and endocarditis sometimes terminates fatally.

NURSING. Efforts are directed towards curing the primary infection which is responsible for the systemic condition. An ice-bag placed upon the inflammation. In some cases the joints are opened for drainage and irrigation. Diet should be liquids or of soft solids and the bowels kept active.

The danger of infection from discharges from the primary infection should be guarded against for fear the germs may come in contact with the mucous membrane of the eyes, nose and mouth. Be extremely careful to disinfect the hands after caring for the patient. The infection of the eyes is serious and one should avoid touching one's eyes even when the hands are disinfected. It may get to be a habit which one may do when the hands are not disinfected, and carry the germ to the eyes. The same care of dishes must be the same as in syphilis. If a nurse should inoculate her hands (when there is a cut or abrasion) she should soak them at once in a bichloride of mercury and immediately consult a physician. (To be continued)
