Here and There

Canadian Pacific steamer *Minnesota* recently brought over to Canada two fine stallions belonging to the Prince of Wales, "Alderman" and "Cruiser", a Clyde, to go the royal ranch at High River, Alberta. The two horses broke their journey at the Toronto Exhibition, and later were carried across the Dominion by Canadian Pacific Express. Special accommodation was provided for them on the *Minnesota*.

Rt. Hon. L. C. M. S. Amery, secretary for the Dominions in the Baldwin administration, fulfilled his wish recently when he climbed Mount Amery, 10,940-foot peak in the Rockies, to accomplish what he had travelled some six thousand miles by Canadian Pacific Express of Australia and lines to Lake Louise from England. He fought his way through blizzards and many other hardships to the top of the peak. He was accompanied by a Swiss guide, Edward Feuz, of Lake Louise.

"Mr. Churchill looked very funny working on one of father's threshing machines," said the Hon. George Rodney, aged ten, who with his younger brother John recently travelled to England to take up schooling. Winston Churchill is a cousin of Lord Rodney who operates a ranch at Fort Saskatchewan, Alberta.

The fourth game refuge has been established in New Brunswick by the provincial government at Beauséjour, consisting of 43 square miles located in Carleton and York counties. This makes a total in all of about 640 square miles of territory set aside in the province as game sanctuaries since 1919.

Hon. J. L. Perron, Quebec minister of agriculture, has announced the loan of two-thirds of the purchase price of pure-bred sheep without interest charges, to Quebec farmers. He aims to place 25,000 pure-bred sheep throughout the province to bring in a yearly revenue of \$250,000.

A yield of 3,599,995 barrels of apples is expected in Canada this year, as compared with 3,235,970 in 1928. Compared with the five-year average of 2,965,510 barrels this is an increase of 20%, making it a bumper crop.

Homestead entries in the four western provinces continue to run well ahead of last year. For the half year they number 7,129 as compared with 5,165 in the same six months period of 1928. Alberta topped the list with 4,052 filings; Saskatchewan followed with 2,381; British Columbia recorded 371 and Manitoba 325.

Sixty-three wells are being drilled in the Turner Valley, 30 miles south-west of Calgary. 21 are just about to be started and 28 are producing crude naphtha or crude oil—a total of 112 wells. Mr. Winston Churchill, on his recent trip across the Dominion by Canadian Pacific paid a special visit to the Turner Valley accompanied by Mayor Osborne of Calgary.

Selection is announced of John W. Dufoe, Editor of the *Winnipeg Free Press*, to act as a commissioner on the part of the United States on the International Commission under the Treaty for the Advancement of Peace between the United States and Germany. Mr. Dufoe was selected for this post by the United States Government acting through Hon. William Phillips, United States Minister to Canada. The International Commission now being set up by the United States and Germany is to have five members, of which Mr. Dufoe is the first to be named. All disputes between the United States and Germany, after ordinary diplomatic proceedings have failed, are to be referred to the Commission.

PUBLIC NOTICE

To All Persons Having Registered Claims or Claims of which No Notice has been Registered existing prior to June 1st, 1930, against lands in any Registry Division in Ontario.

Whereas "The Investigation of Titles Act, 1929," enacts inter alia:

3 (1)—From and after the coming into force of this sub-section, no person in dealing with land shall be required to show that he is lawfully entitled to such land as owner thereof through a good and sufficient chain of title, save and except during the period of forty years immediately preceding the date of such dealing as aforesaid, and no claim which has been in existence longer than the said forty year period shall affect such land, unless such claim shall have been acknowledged or specifically referred to or contained in an instrument registered against such land within the said forty-year period or unless a notice is registered against such land as provided in sub-sections 3, 4 and 5 hereof.

3 (2) Sub-section 1 shall come into force on the 1st day of June, 1930.

3 (3) Upon the coming into force of this Act and within one year thereafter, any person having a claim against any land, which claim has been in existence for forty years or more prior to the coming into force of this Act, but in respect to which claim no notice of its existence has been given, acknowledged, or specifically referred to or contained in an instrument registered against such land within forty years prior to the coming into force of this Act, or any person on his behalf may register in the proper registry office a notice in which shall be set forth the claimant's full name and address and a description of the land and a detailed statement of such claim, verified by the affidavit of the person registering such notice.

3 (6) The registration of a notice as provided in sub-sections 3, 4 and 5 shall not in any way validate a claim which has otherwise expired.

THEREFORE TAKE NOTICE that any person having a claim against any land as above set forth must register notice thereof in the proper registry office before June 1st, 1930. If this is not done, except under certain conditions, then any land which is subject to such claim so registered prior to June 1st, 1930, or any claim existing prior to June 1st, 1930, of which no notice has been registered, shall be absolutely freed and released therefrom.

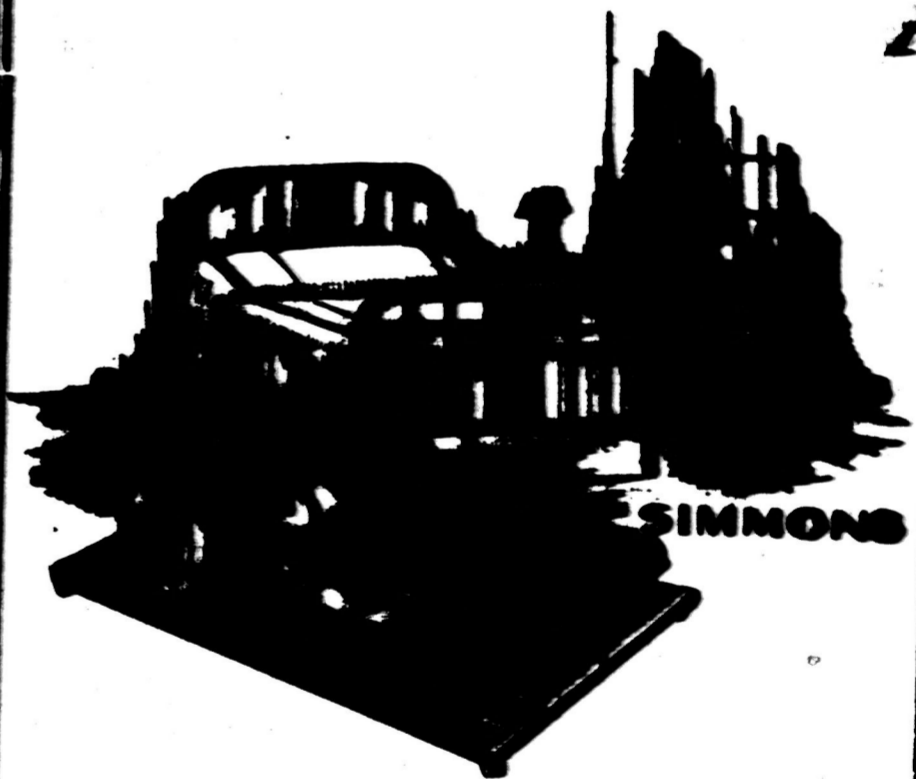
