Famous Chinese Statesman Here at Canadian Festival

Dr. Teyhi Hsieh Will Be Heard
in His Noble Lecture on
Present-Day China

The blood of China's ancient aristocracy and the spirit of modern democracy mingle in the person of Dr. Teyhi Hsieh, noted Chinese diplomat and statesman, who will deliver his stimulating lecture, "Inside Light of Present-Day China" at the coming Canadian Chautauqua Festival here.

That Canadians may gain a truer view of China and her problems is Doctor Hsieh's mission in coming to the Dominion—and China could not have found an emissary better suited for the task. Doctor Hsieh is a brilliant orator, a master of the English

language and a keen student of international affairs. It has been said of him that he is the national interpreter of Chinese aspirations, philosophy and hopes.

An editorial in the Toronto Globe speaks of Doctor Hsieh as follows:

"One of the most cultured as well as wildest visitors Toronto has had in many a day is Dr. Teyhi Hsieh of China, guest of the Board of Trade. Doctor Hsieh, in addition to much Oriental lore, knows the Occident better than most of us. He is a graduate of Cambridge and has had wide diplomatic experience on both sides of the Atlantic. He is typical of Young China, which now is rapidly taking over all that rightly belongs to China from the corrupt hands of the Old Regime. We all might learn a good deal from this brilliant representative of China."

Here and There

Running well ahead of schedule steel work on the 21-story addition to the Empire's largest hotel, the Royal York, additional construction is being rapidly pushed forward and the sixth story is now completed. All steel work is expected to be finished early in February and everything will be completed by June 1st, when there will be a total of 1,181 guest rooms at this palatial Toronto hostelry.

Hitting a 98-mile an hour clip, a special Canadian Pacific train recently carried two-and-a-half-year-old Delphis Morin, who was thought to be dying of intestinal influenza, from Sudbury to Toronto, for a blood transfusion in the Toronto Western Hospital. Leaving at 1:05 the train reached destination at 4:35, all traffic having been held aside for the special. At 8 the operation was performed and half an hour later the boy was smiling at his friends. He is now well on his way to recovery.

Fighting against Atlantic winter gales the cable ship John W. MacKay has just successfully completed another episode of the sea in effecting repairs to the high speed cable of the Commercial Cable Company over which much of Canadian Pacific cable business is carried to Europe. The cable was smashed in the great 'quake of November 19, the break being discovered within 36 hours of the arrival of the ship on the scene, raising the cable from a depth of 2½ miles and at a point 30 miles from the western end of the break being part of the job to be done.

"Canary Kordyke Alcantara" a five-year-old Holstein Friesian cow, which a year ago claimed the world's championship as a butter-fat producer, with 25,395 pounds of milk containing 1,000 pounds of butter-fat in 395 days, has beaten her own record. Following her 1923 own record. Following her 1923 record this famous cow was the guest of honour at a banquet in Moose Jaw. The latest record for "Canary Kordyke Alcantara," is 20,394 pounds of milk with 1,336.25 pounds of butter-fat.

Money to the amount of \$5,181 pounds was produced in Nova Scotia in 1923, according to official figures, and the 1923 output will likely be much larger as the summer season of that year was much more favorable, says Philip Bishop, of Greenwich (Fort William), the largest bee-keeper in Nova Scotia.

Within from four to five years thousands of farmers throughout the province of Saskatchewan will have the benefit of all-weather roads running in all directions. The provincial government plans to spend \$5,000,000 annually during the next few years on the construction of six main highways, all-weather surfaced.

Notwithstanding the growing popularity of the motor car and motor power farm implements, the horse is evidently not going into the discard as rapidly as some people might be inclined to believe. Latest official estimate of number of farm horses in Canada as in June, 1923, is placed at 2,376,467. In 1919 the number was 2,667,263, a difference of only 290,792.

About 50,000 tons of hay have recently been exported from Eastern Ontario and Quebec to buyers in the British Isles. The 1923 exports of hay from Canada are greatly in excess of those of 1923.

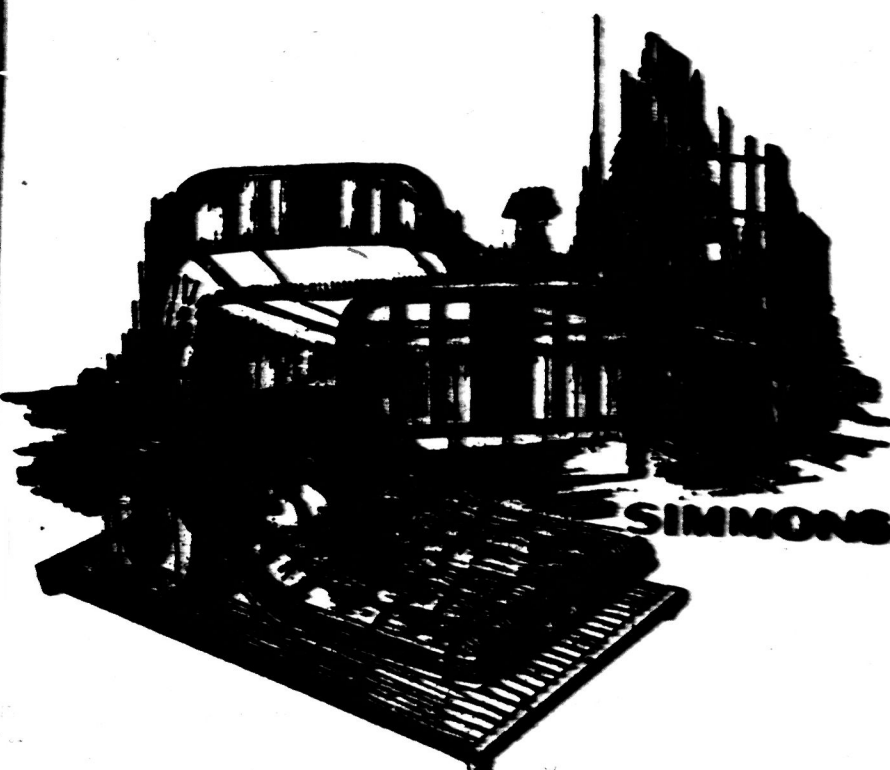
