With 15 Months' Supplies Scientists Brave Unknown Land

Leningrad. — A group of Soviet scientists led by Professor Otto Schmidt and including Profesor R. L. Somoilovitch, Professor D. U. Wiese and several others have departed for Archangel, where they will embark on lute safe medicine, being guaranteed an icebreaker for Fridtjof Nansen Land, formerly Franzz Joseph Land, to explore its possibilities of develop-

The geographical features, natural resources and hunting possibilities of the Arctic islands will be thoroughly investigated. The expedition is equipped with supplies for fifteen months. Its members will visit areas upon which no human foot ever before trod. They will explore the Ise of Isolation in the Kara Sea and a considerable part of the Polar Ocean. They will bring radio operators and other techradio station on Nansen Island.

The explorers will place upon "North Land," formerly Nicholas II. Land, colonists to form a neucleus of a future Russian settlement. These will he a small group of Soviet volunteers. including former Governor G. A. Ushakov, on Wrangel Island, who will be the first person known to have visited that remote part of the earth.

"The Soviet government has the greatest sector of Polar territory in the world." said Professor Schmidt before his departure. "Therefore there is an international obligation upon us to study this little known region as of science."


